In consideration of his faithful services,
and of the sum of five shillings current
money, in hand paid before the executing and
delivery of these presents by my negro man
named Matt. alias Matt. Brown, the I Samuel
Judson Justice of Peace for the County, have
manumitted, and set free, and by these
presents do manumit and set free the said
negro man ~~alias~~ ~~and~~
him from all further service and exp^{ts}
that the said negro Matt. shall hereafter
be brought into servitude by me, my executor,
or administrators, but shall be at full and

perfect liberty to go whithersoever he may
think proper, and to do with himself as
he may please. In testimony of which I
have hereto set my hand, and affixed my
seal this Twentieth day of December, in
the year eighteen hundred and three

in the presence of us Saml Coolidge
