On all goods, wares and merchandize, imported directly from China or India in ships or vessels, which are not of the United States, teas excepted, twelve and a half per centum ad valorem.

And generally, feven and a half per cent, ad valorem, on all goods, wares and merchandize, not particularly enumerated in the above lift; except the following, which, by express provision a feveral statutes, are permitted to be imported free from duty, witt:

Bullion, tin, and copper in pigs, copper in bars, tin plates, old pewter, brafs teutenague, iron and brafs wire, copper in plates, falt petre, plaister of Paris, wool, dying woods and dying drugs, raw hides and fkins, all undreiled furs, the featheres of hips and veffels, the cloths, books, houshold furniture, tools and aplements of trade and profession of persons coming to reside the United ! tates, philosophical apparatus specially imported or any feminary of learning, all goods intended to he re-exported to any foreign port or place in the fame ship or vessel in shich they shall have been imported, lapis caliminaris, unmanyctured wood, wood, full hur, horfes, cattle, theep, fwine, and her ufeful beatts imported for breed, and during one war i m the 22d ay 1794, bress cannor, muliets and firebooks a bayonets fuited to them, plitols, frontly, cuttaffer, market I, lead and gun-powder, and generally, all articles of the greath, product or manufactures of the United tates,

The duties specified in the above list respect goods, &c. imported in vessels of the United States, except where foreign vessels are particularly mentioned; and those cases excepted, an additional duty of ten per cent. is imposed on all goods, war and merchandize imported in foreign vessels.

On the tonnage of ships or vessels are imposed the following

duties, to wit

On thips or vessels of the United States when entered from any foreign port or place; and when entered in a diffrict in one state from a district in another state (other than an adjoining state on the sea coast, or on a navigable river; and other than vessels duly licensed, employed in the coasting trade, or in the bank or whale fisheries, which are exempt from paying tonnage, while fo employed, more than once in a year) having on board goods, wares and merchandize, taken in, in one flate, to be delivered in another, at the rate of fix cents per ton. On ships or vessels built within the United States fince the 20th July 1789, but owned wholly or in part by foreigners, when entered from a foreign port or place, at the rate of thirty cents per ton; on all other Pips or veffels when entered from a foreign port or place, at the rate of fifty cents per ton : and on all flips or vessels not of the United States, when entered in one diffrict from another diffrict, having on board goods wares and merchandize taken in, in one district, to be delivered in another, at the rate of fifty cents per ton.

To afcertain the tonnage of a ship, if the same be double decked, take the length thereof from the fore part of the main slem to the after part of the stern post above the upper deck; the breadth at the broadest part above the main wales; half of which breadth account the depth, deduct from the length three sifths of the breadth; multiply the remainder by the breadth and that product by the depth; and divide the last product by ninety-sive. If the ship be single decked, take the length and breadth as above directed; take the depth from the underside of the deck plank to the ceiling in the hold; and deducting from the length three sifths of the breadth, multiply and divide as aforesaid.

Duties on tomage must be paid within ten days after report of the cargo made to the collector; and any master of a vessel leaving or attempting to leave a port without paying such duties

And on stills employed in distilling spirits from materials of the growth or produce of the United states, at any other place than a City, town or village; or at any distillery within a city, town or village, at which the still (or stills, if more than one) shall be of less capacity than four hundered gallons, fifty four cents per annum for every gallon anglish wine measure of the content of such still including the head thereof.

It being at the option, how er of the proprietor of any fill, to pay, in lieu of the aforefaid yearly duty either faces cents for every gallon of fpirits by him or her distilled; or to pay at the rate of ten cents per gallon of the capacity for every menth's employment of his or her fill; notifying such choice to the

proper officer, and obtaining a license duly executed for the

stipulated time.

Having enumerated the feveral duties payable on importations on the tonnage of vessels, and on domestic objects, it will be proper to say something on the subject of drawbacks, bounties and other allowances.

On all goods, wares and merchandize, (spirits, manufacture tobacco, souff and refined sugar excepted,) for which duties, o importation, to the amount of twenty dollars shall have been paid, or secured, there is allowed, if the same, within twelve calendar months, be re-exported to any foreign country, a draw back equivalent to the duties so paid or secured, deducting there from, as an indemnissication for the expence which may have accrued by storage, sees of officers, and the like, one per cent.

On spirits, if the same amount to one hundred and fifty glons, and be exported in vessels of thirty tons and upwards, allowance, by way of drawback, for every gallon exported, equivalent to the impost per gallon according to the respective proofs, declucting, for the purposes aforesaid, half a cent per gallon: Amon spirits distilled within the United States from imported molasses, an additional allowance of three cents per gallon: to

balance the duty on that article.

On pickled fish of the sisheries of the United States, eighteen cents per barrel, and on other provisions salted within the said States, sisteen cents per barrel (provided the bounty amount to three dollars) at their exportation, as an equivalent for the

duty on falt.

There is also an annual bounty payable on the last day o December, in lieu of a former allowance on dried fish, to the owners or agents of fishing vessels legally qualified and employ ed in carryng on the bank, and other codfisheries, and which shall be therein employed four months during the fishing season reckoning from the last day of February to the last day of No vember, one doller and twenty cents for every ton of the actual admeasurement of such vessels or boats, as are more than sive and lefs then twenty tons burthen, and shall have landed during the preceeding feafon a quantity of fifth, which when cured and fit for exportation, shall be equal to twelve quintals for every on of her faid admeasurement; the allowance in this case to he accounted as part of the pre seds of the fares of the faid boa or veffel, and to be fo divided among the perfons interested : one distar and eighty cents for every ton of admeasurement of such with a are between twenty and thirty tons burthen : and three thes for every ton of fuch veffels as exceed thirty ton bur it : provides the allogrance to any one veffel do not, in a feafon, exceed one hundred and feventy dollars. The allowances in the two cases last mentioned are to be divided, three eighths to the owners of the vessels, and five eighths to the sishermen employed therein the preceding season, in such proportion as the quantity of fish by them respectively taken shall bear to the the whole quantity taken on board such vessels during the said season—

Besides the above specified drawbacks and allowances, which entitle the exporter, &c. to the receipt of money, there are fundry other allowances, which tend to diminish the duty to the

importer, &c.
