The speaker of the house of representatives receives 12 dollars, and each member of either house the sum of six dollars for every day's attendance in Congress: and at the commencement and end of every session six dollars for every twenty miles distant by the shortest road, between the seat of government and their respective habitations. The secretary of the senate and clerk of the house of representatives, have each an annual salary of 1500 dollars, and two dollars per day during the session.

After the 4th. of March 1795, the members of the senate will receive seven dollars per day.

The chaplains of each house are allowed at the rate of 500 dollars per annum. The Serjeant at arms of the house of representatives has four dollars per day during the session. The door keepers have each 500 dollars; and the assistant door keepers 450 dollars per annum.

On all goods, wares and merchandize, imported directly from China or India in ships or vessels, which are not of the United States, teas excepted, twelve and a half per centum ad valorem.

And generally, seven and a half per cent. ad valorem, on all goods, wares and merchandize, not particularly enumerated in the above list; except the following, which, by express provision in several statutes, are permitted to be imported free from duty, to-wit:

Bullion, tin, and copper in pigs, copper in bars, tin plates, old pewter, brass teutenague, iron and brass wire, copper in plates, salt petre, plaitter of Paris, wool, dying woods and dying drugs, raw hides and skins, all undressed furs, the seastores of ships and vessels, the cloths, books, household furniture, tools and implements of trade and profession of persons coming to reside in the United States, philosophical apparatus specially imported for any seminary of learning, all goods intended to be re-exported to any foreign port or place in the same ship or vessel in which they shall have been imported, lapis calcinarius, unmanufactured wool, wood, sulphur, horses, cattle, sheep, swine, and other useful beasts imported for breed, and during one year from the 22d day 1794, brass cannon, muskets and firelocks with bayonets suited to them, pistols, swords, cutlasses, musket iron, lead and gun-powder, and generally, all articles of the growth, product or manufactures of the United States.

The duties specified in the above list respect goods, &c. imported in vessels of the United States, except where foreign vessels are particularly mentioned; and those cases excepted, an additional duty of ten per cent. is imposed on all goods, wares and merchandize imported in foreign vessels.

On the tonnage of ships or vessels are imposed the following duties, to wit

On ships or vessels of the United States when entered from any foreign port or place; and when entered in a district in one state from a district in another state (other than an adjoining state on the sea coast, or on a navigable river; and other than vessels duly licensed, employed in the coasting trade, or in the bank or whale fisheries, which are exempt from paying tonnage, while so employed, more than once in a year) having on board goods, wares and merchandize, taken in, in one state, to be delivered in another, at the rate of six cents per ton. On ships or vessels built within the United States since the 20th July 1789, but owned wholly or in part by foreigners, when entered from a foreign port or place, at the rate of thirty cents per ton; on all other ships or vessels when entered from a foreign port or place, at the rate of fifty cents per ton: and on all ships or vessels not of the United States, when entered in one district from another district, having on board goods wares and merchandize taken in, in one district, to be delivered in another, at the rate of fifty cents per ton.

To ascertain the tonnage of a ship, if the same be double decked, take the length thereof from the fore part of the main stem to the after part of the stern post above the upper deck; the breadth at the broadest part above the main wales; half of which breadth account the depth, deduct from the length three fifths of the breadth; multiply the remainder by the breadth and that product by the depth; and divide the last product by ninety-five. If the ship be single decked, take the length and breadth as above directed; take the depth from the underside of the deck plank to the ceiling in the hold; and deducting from the length three fifths of the breadth, multiply and divide as aforesaid.

Duties on tonnage must be paid within ten days after report of the cargo made to the collector; and any master of a vessel leaving or attempting to leave a port without paying such duties shall be liable to a fine of five hundred dollars.

To determine the ad valorem rates of duty, add to the actual cost of the goods twenty per cent. if imported from, or from beyond the Cape of Good-Hope; and ten per cent. if imported from any other place or country, exclusive of charges.

And on stills employed in distilling spirits from materials of the growth or produce of the United States, at any other place than a City, town or village; or at any distillery within a city, town or village, at which the still (or stills, if more than one) shall be of less capacity than four hundred gallons, fifty four cents per annum for every gallon English wine measure of the content of such still including the head thereof.

It being at the option, however of the proprietor of any still, to pay, in lieu of the aforesaid yearly duty either seven cents for every gallon of spirits by him or her distilled; or to pay at the rate of ten cents per gallon of the capacity for every month's employment of his or her still; notifying such choice to the

proper officer, and obtaining a license duly executed for the stipulated time.

Having enumerated the several duties payable on importations on the tonnage of vessels, and on domestic objects, it will be proper to say something on the subject of drawbacks, bounties and other allowances.

On all goods, wares and merchandize, (spirits, manufacture tobacco, snuff and refined sugar excepted,) for which duties, on importation, to the amount of twenty dollars shall have been paid, or secured, there is allowed, if the same, within twelve calendar months, be re-exported to any foreign country, a drawback equivalent to the duties so paid or secured, deducting therefrom, as an indemnification for the expence which may have accrued by storage, fees of officers, and the like, one per cent.

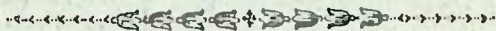
On spirits, if the same amount to one hundred and fifty gallons, and be exported in vessels of thirty tons and upwards, an allowance, by way of drawback, for every gallon exported, equal to the impost per gallon according to the respective proofs, deducting, for the purposes aforesaid, half a cent per gallon: And on spirits distilled within the United States from imported molasses, an additional allowance of three cents per gallon: to balance the duty on that article.

On pickled fish of the fisheries of the United States, eighteen cents per barrel, and on other provisions salted within the said States, fifteen cents per barrel (provided the bounty amount to three dollars) at their exportation, as an equivalent for the duty on salt.

There is also an annual bounty payable on the last day of December, in lieu of a former allowance on dried fish, to the owners or agents of fishing vessels legally qualified and employed in carrying on the bank, and other codfisheries, and which shall be therein employed four months during the fishing season, reckoning from the last day of February to the last day of November, one dollar and twenty cents for every ton of the actual admeasurement of such vessels or boats, as are more than five, and less than twenty tons burthen, and shall have landed during the preceeding season a quantity of fish, which when cured and fit for exportation, shall be equal to twelve quintals for every ton of her said admeasurement; the allowance in this case to be accounted as part of the proceeds of the fares of the said boat or vessel, and to be so divided among the persons interested: one dollar and eighty cents for every ton of admeasurement of such vessels as are between twenty and thirty tons burthen: and three dollars for every ton of such vessels as exceed thirty ton burthen: provided the allowance to any one vessel do not, in a sea-

son, exceed one hundred and seventy dollars. The allowances in the two cases last mentioned are to be divided, three eighths to the owners of the vessels, and five eighths to the fishermen employed therein the preceding season, in such proportion as the quantity of fish by them respectively taken shall bear to the the whole quantity taken on board such vessels during the said season—

Besides the above specified drawbacks and allowances, which entitle the exporter, &c. to the receipt of money, there are sundry other allowances, which tend to diminish the duty to the importer, &c.

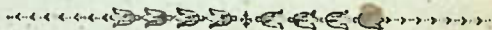
