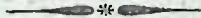

 POST OFFICE ESTABLISHMENT.

The post office establishment is under the direction of a post master general, whose office is called the general post office, and is kept at the seat of government.

Congress by special acts, establish such post roads as appear to them expedient. At this time there is a main post road which extends 1733 miles ; from Scodic, on the north eastern extremity of the sea coast of the United States to St. Mary's on the south eastern extremity, and branches or cross roads, which keep up a communication, between the capital of the United States and the capitals of the individual states, and also with every city or village of any note. The aggregate of the extent of the several post roads is 26,000 miles.

The mail is carried by contracts made with the post master general, who has divided the whole into nearly 360 routes or contracts, and stipulates for its conveyance as often, and with such expedition as he finds the public interest requires. It is now carried every day between the great commercial towns, twice a week to the capitals of each state where they are not commercial, and once a week to other places. The usual rates of travelling on the cross roads is 40 miles a day, and from 60 to 120 miles in 24 hours between the great commercial towns.

Post offices are established by the post master general at such places as he considers it expedient. There are already rising of 1500 in the United states.

Stages are erected for the conveyance of the mail and passengers, from Wiscasset in Maine, to St. Mary's in Georgia, and on many of the cross roads.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

For single letters, (such as are composed of one piece of paper) and carried not exceeding 40 miles, eight cents, over 40 miles and not over 90 miles, ten cents, over 90 miles

and not over 150 miles, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents, over 150 miles, and not over 300 miles, 17 cents, over 300 miles, and not over 500 miles, 20 cents, over 500 miles 25 cents. Double letters or those composed of two pieces, double those rates, tripple letters or those composed of three pieces, thripple those rates, quadruple letters or those composed of four pieces, quadruple those rates, packets or letters containing more than three inclosures, are charged by weight, each quarter ounce being equal to a single letter.

Postage on Newspapers.

Each paper carried not exceeding 100 miles, one cent, over 100 miles and out of the state where printed, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ do.

Postage on Magazines and Pamphlets.

For each sheet carried not over 50 miles, one cent, over 50 miles and not over 100, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ over 100 miles two cents.

Neither magazines nor pamphlets are admitted into the mail when they are addressed to places, to which the mail is carried on horse back.

Those who send letters, may either pay the postage in advance or leave it to be paid by their correspondents.

When letters have lain in a post office three months, they are then called dead letters, and are returned to the general post office, where they are opened; if they contain nothing which appears to be valuable, they are destroyed; if they contain any thing which appears to be valuable, they are returned to the writer if his residence is known, and if not known, they are preserved in the office.

A pound of pure gold is valued at 15 pounds of pure silver.

The gold and silver coins of Great Britain, France, Spain and Portugal, were allowed by law to be tendered in payments, at the rates following, viz.

The gold coins of Great Britain and Portugal of their present standard, at the rate of 89 cents for one pennyweight; and those of France and Spain at the rate of 87 cents for one pennyweight. The Spanish milled dollar weighing not less than 17 pennyweights 7 grains at 100 cents; and the crown of France containing not less than 18 pennyweights 17 grains at 110 cents; but at the expiration of three years after the coining of gold and silver commenced at the mint of the United States, all foreign coins were to cease from being a legal tender, except Spanish milled dollars, and parts thereof. And at the expiration of six months after cents and half cents to the value of 50,000 dollars, shall have been issued, all other copper coins are forbidden under the penalty of ten dollars and the forfeiture of the pieces so offered.

NEW COURT OF APPEALS

Held at Annapolis, on the third Tuesday in February, the fourth Tuesday in June, the first Tuesday in October, and the third Tuesday in December.

The courts under the new judiciary system are held in the several counties at the times following, to wit :

Charles—Third Monday in March and August.

Prince-George's—First Monday in April and September.

Cecil—First Monday in April and September.

Kent—Third Monday in March and September.

Queen-Anne's—First Monday in March and fourth Monday in October.

Talbot—Fourth Monday in May and second Monday in November.

Calvert—Second Monday in May and October.

Anna-Arundel—Third Monday in May and September.

Montgomery—First Monday in March and November.

Caroline—First Monday in March and second Monday in October.

Dorchester—Third Monday in March and fourth Monday in October.

Somerset—Second Monday in April and September.

Worcester—Fourth Monday in May and November.

Frederick—First Monday in February and August.

Washington—Fourth Monday in March and October.


Allegany—Third Monday in April and second Monday in October.

CRIMINAL COURT.

Baltimore.—Second Monday in January, First Monday in March, Second Monday in July, and Third Monday in Sept. Walter Dorsey Esq. chief judge, George G. Presbury and Job Smith Esqrs. associate judges.

ORPHANS' COURT

For the different counties, are generally held in the same pñaces where the county courts are held, on the second Tuesday in February, April, June, August, October, and December. G. G. Presbury, Owen Dorsey and Thomas Dickson, Esqrs. judges.  Exclusive of the above there is a court held every Wednesday and Saturday in the city of Baltimore.

MAYOR'S COURT

For Annapolis, four times annually, viz. the last Tuesday in January, April, July and October.

RATES OF PILOTAGE.

From Baltimore to sea three dollars for each foot of water the vessel shall draw.

From sea to Baltimore three dollars and fifty cents for each foot of water the vessel shall draw.

From sea to the district of Columbia in Maryland, or from thence to sea add one fifth to the above rates. And on vessels not owned by Citizens of the United States add one third to the above rates.

From sea to Newpoint-Comfort one fourth up.

From sea to mouth of Potowmac one half up.

From sea to Annapolis three-fourths up.

From Baltimore to Annapolis one-third down.

Short Method to Calculate Interest.
