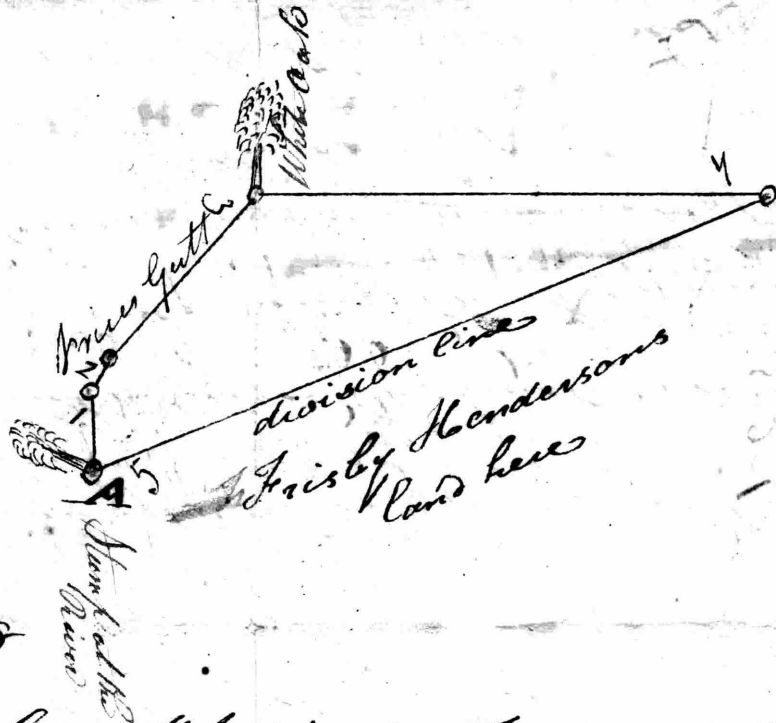

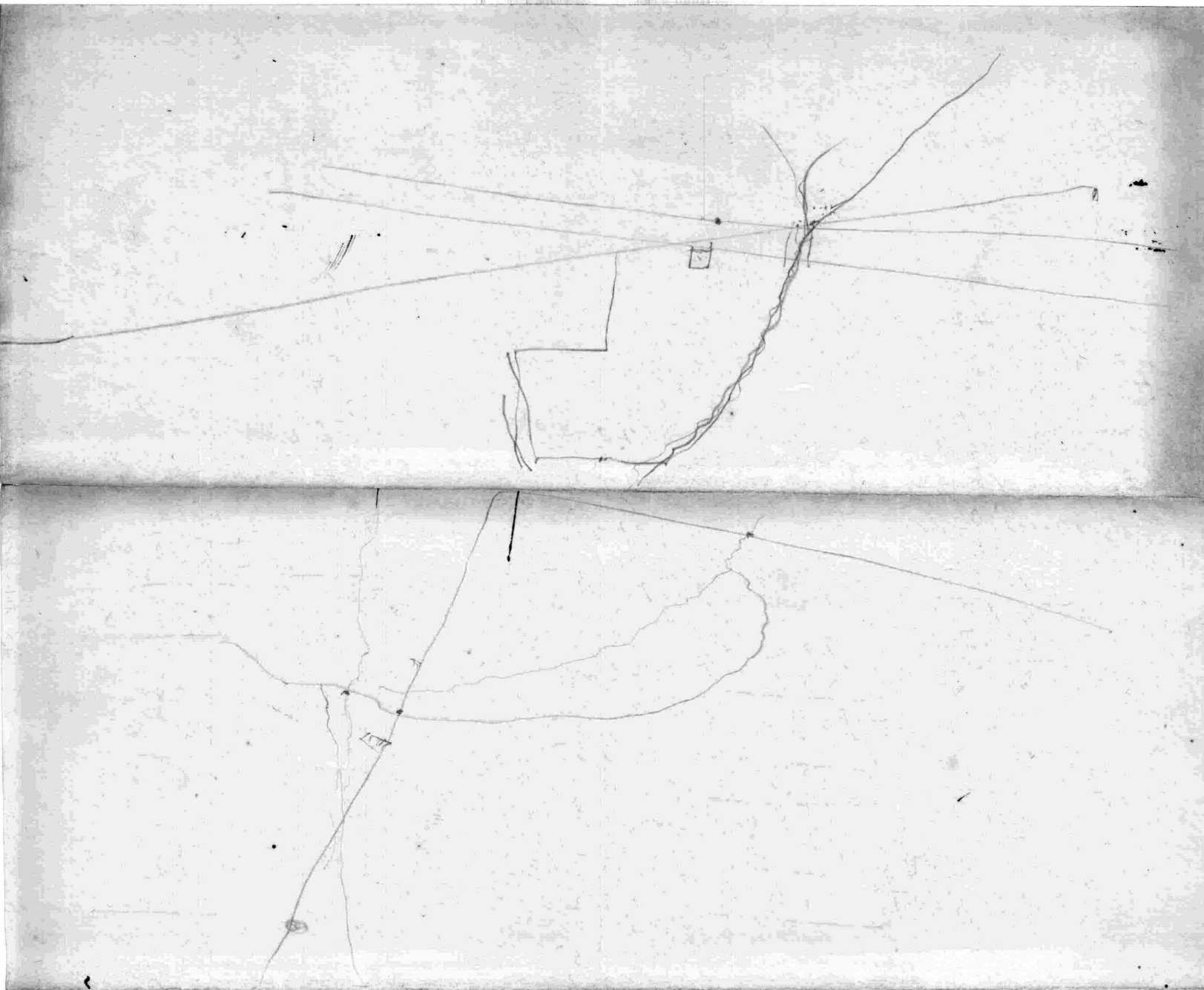

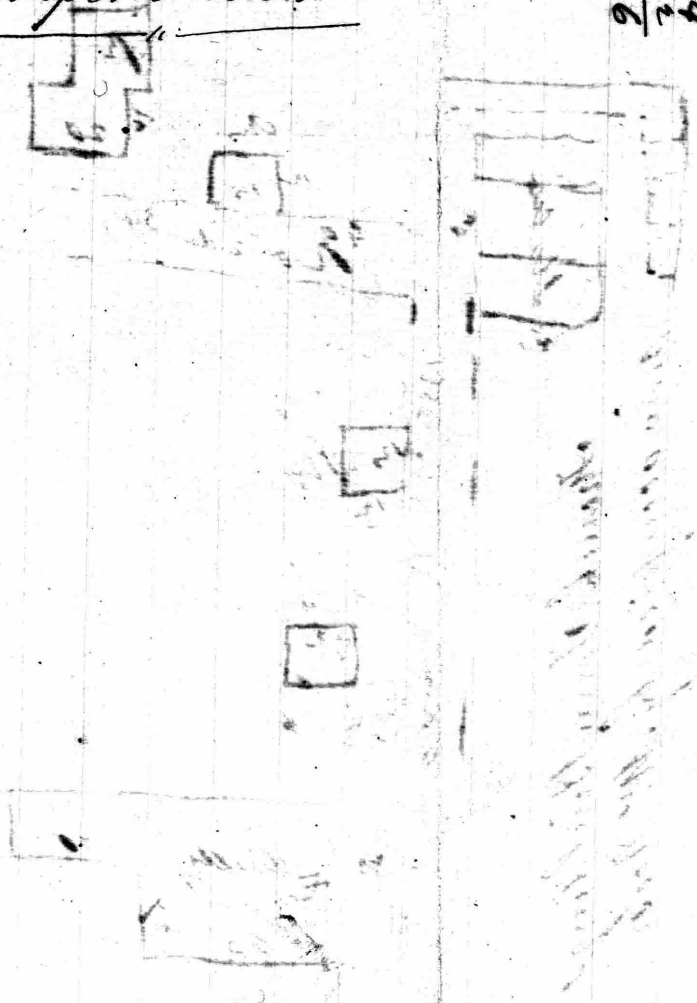

 Improvements.

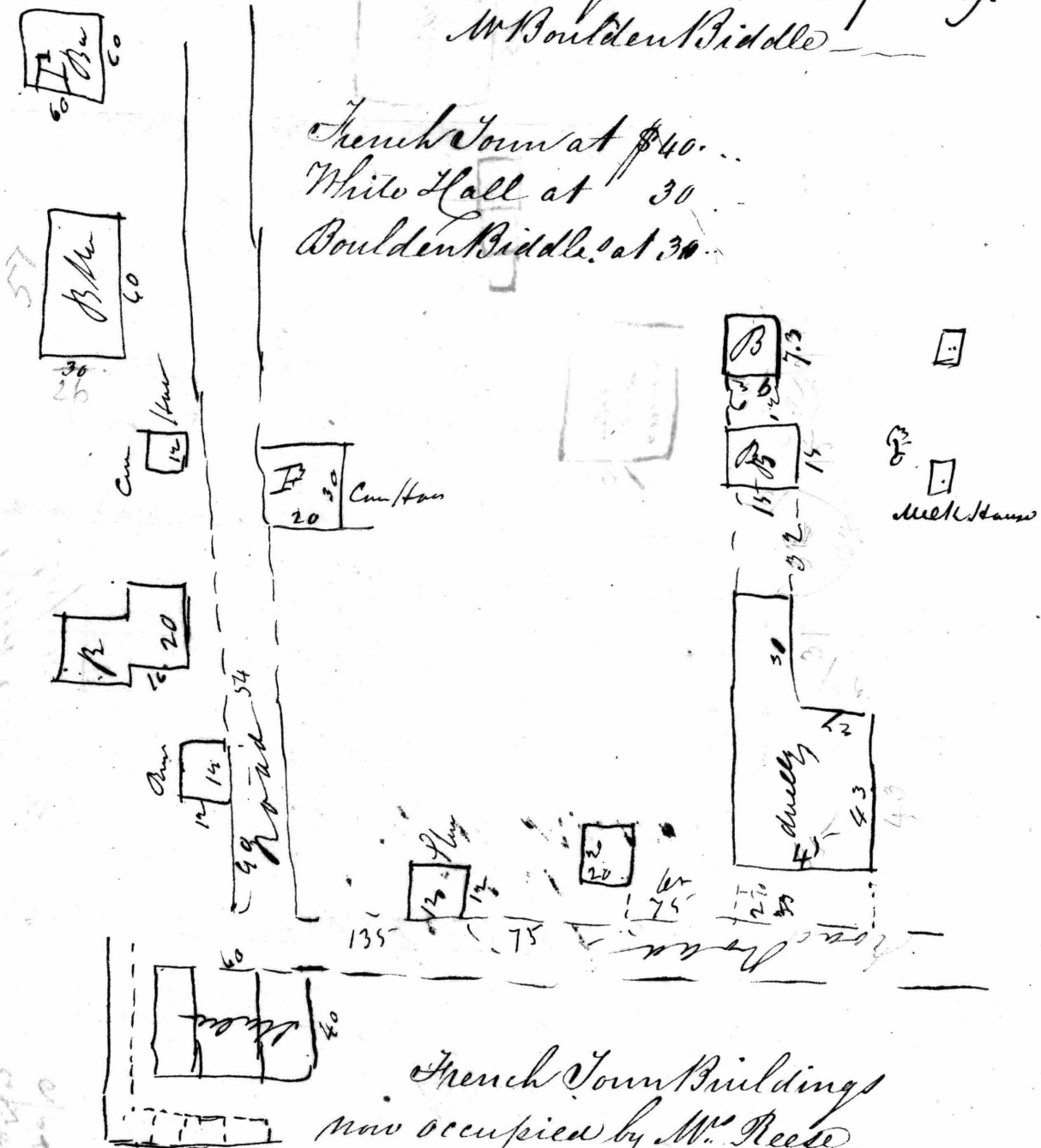

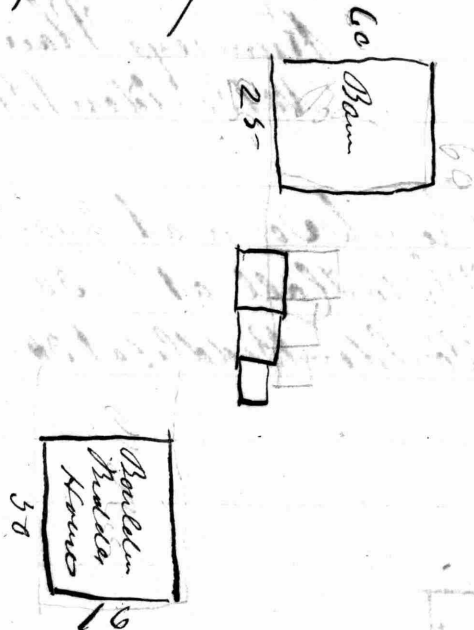
