Between Lydia G. Morris, William H Morris her
husband and Mary, Morris Murray Morris
the eldest child of the said Lydia G Morris
of the first part and John William Munson
Nathaniel G. Munson and William A. Munson
Trustees as hereinafter mentioned of the second
part; Witnesseth that whereas on the 29th day of
April 1857 Sarah Murray now deceased, (The
Grand mother of the said Lydia G. Morris.)
and a certain Josias Green did for the purpose
of straightening the lines of their respective
parcels or parcels of land, situated in Patuxent Neck,
in Balt. Co., in the State of Maryland, make
an exchange of certain parts of their said

said Sarah Murray did then and there enter
into and take peaceable and exclusive
possession of and enclose the parcel of land
containing nine acres and other hundred and

exclusive possession of and enclose the parcel of
land allotted to him in said exchange without

The said Sarah Murray did remain
in such peaceable and exclusive possession of
said parcel of land, containing 9 Acres
129 perches, claiming title thereto in fee simple
under the aforesaid exchange, until the date
of her death now more than Twenty years after
said exchange;

And whereas, in order to confirm the title
of Thomas Creamer and David Creamer, Trustees
who intermediately between the possessors of

Norris the right, title and interest in the aforesaid parcel of land containing 10 A and 142 perches more or less acquired by said Mary Ann Dutton under the aforesaid deed to her from said William Creamer and wife, Liber of W. 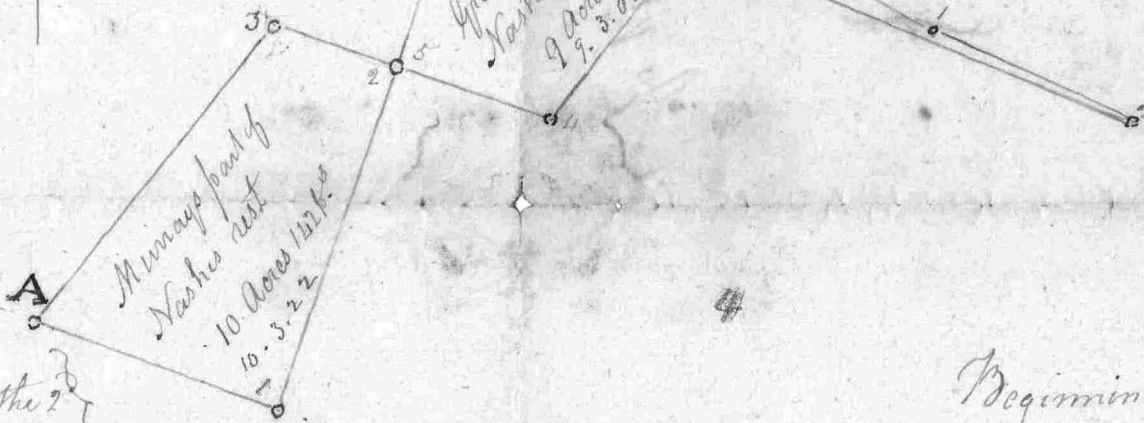
