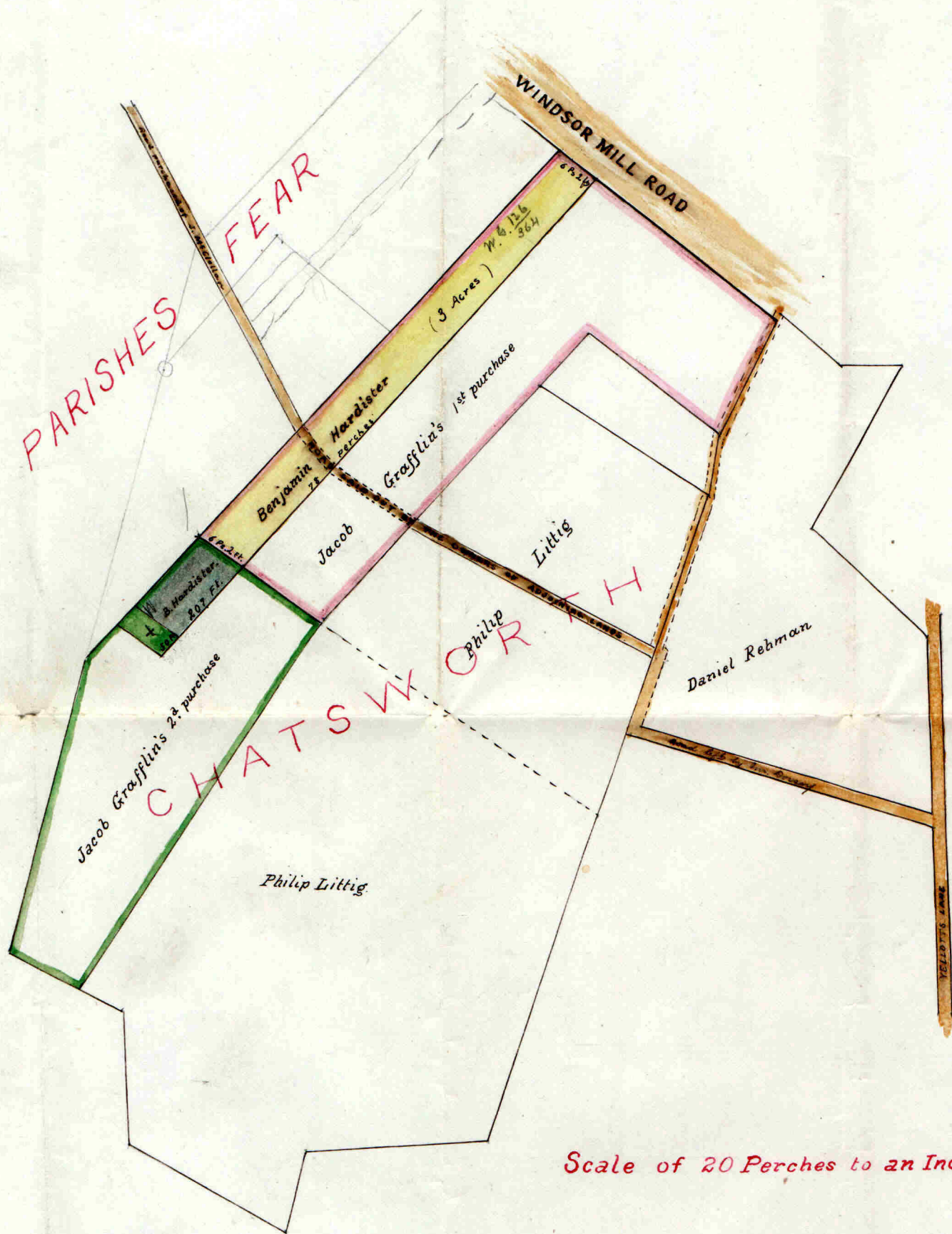

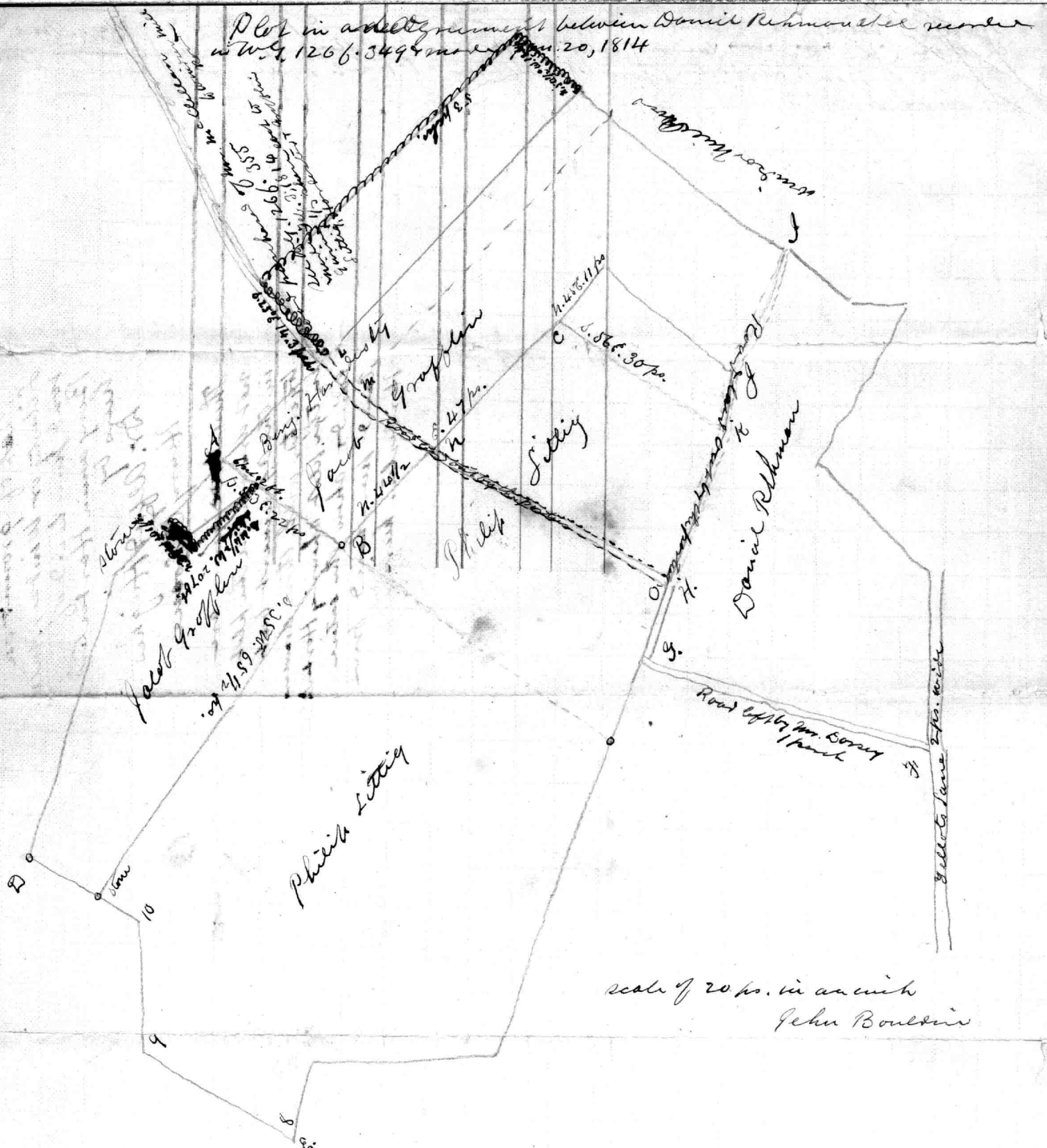
The part within the Red lines constitutes the land purchased by Jacob Grafflin from W. Dorsey Aug 12th 1812.

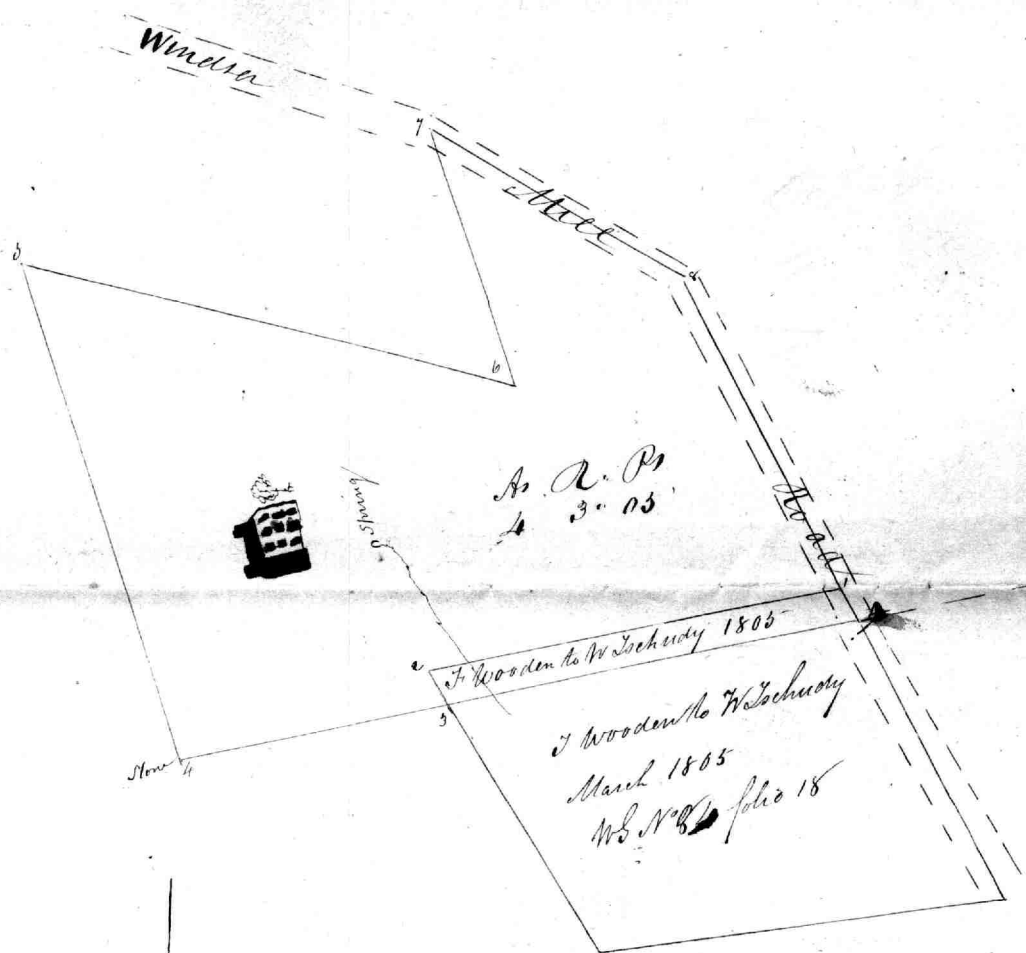
