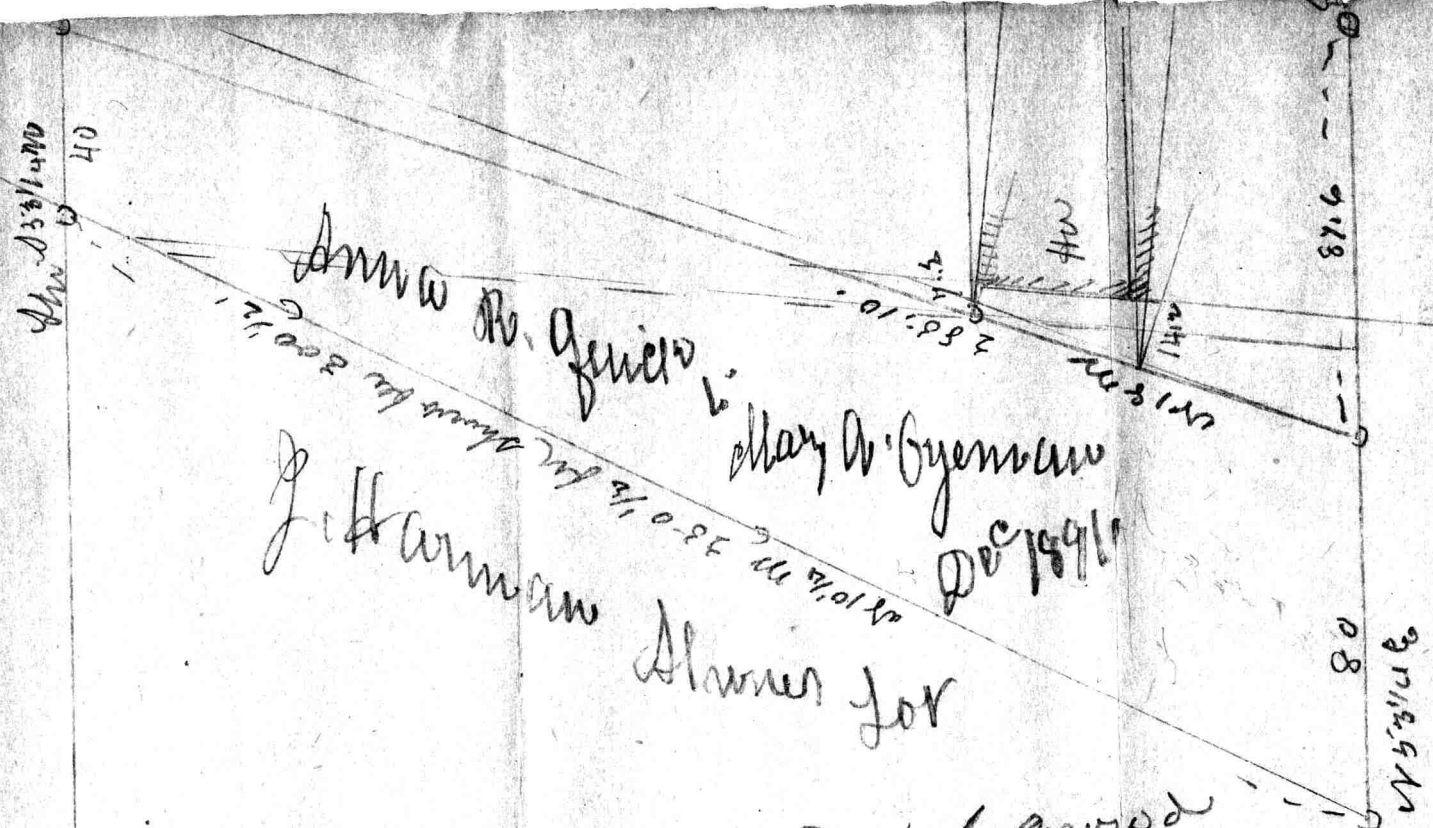

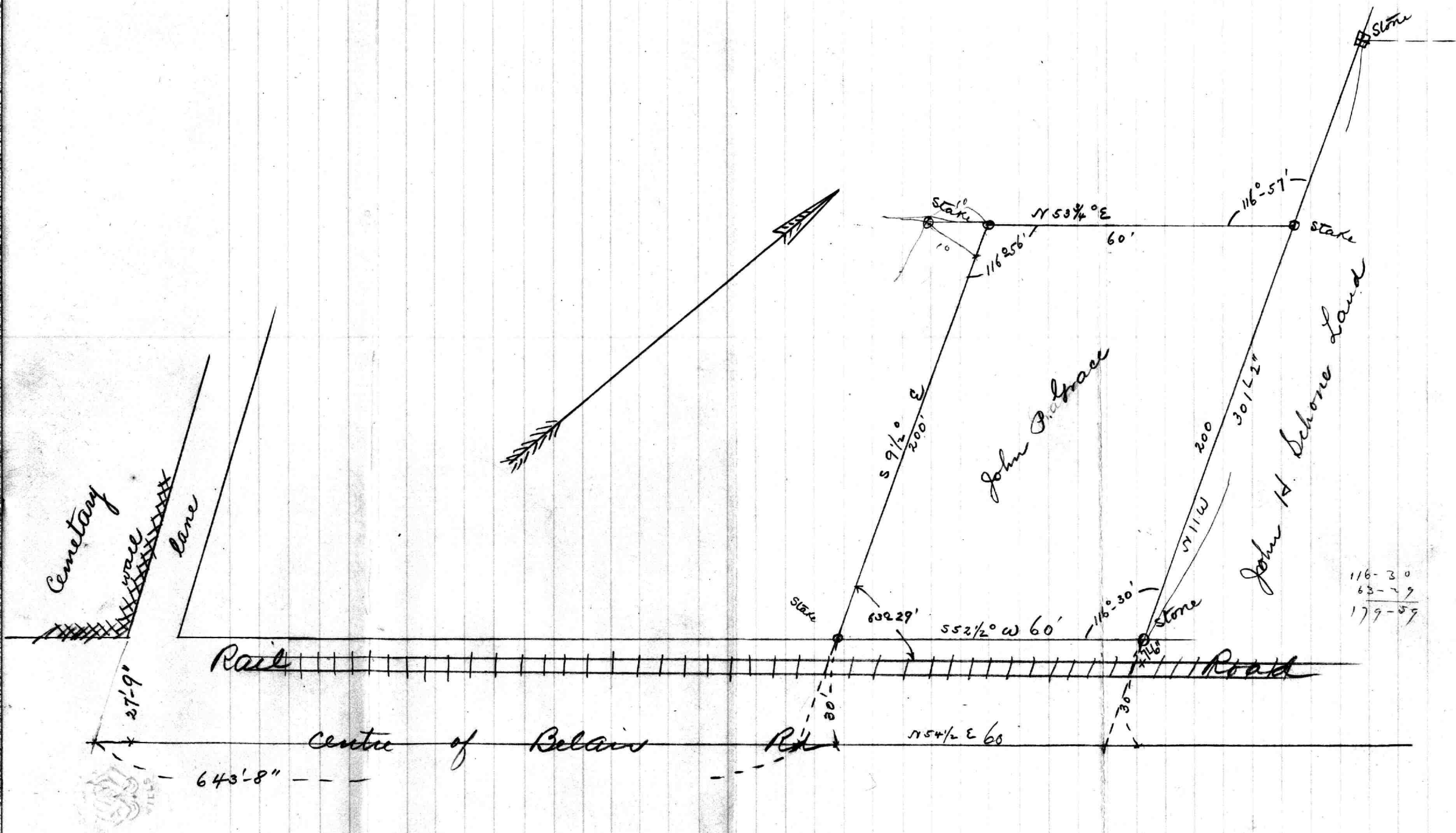

Belle Air road.

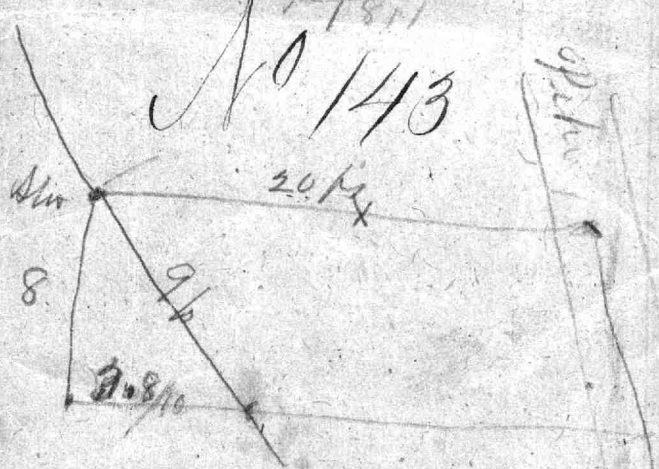
