y Seventeen hundred and fifty nine, as  
appears in our Land Office, and upon such  
Conditions and terms as are expressed in our  
Conditions of plantation of our said Province,  
bearing date the fifth day of April sixteen hun-  
-dred and eighty four, and remaining upon  
record in our said Province, Together with  
such alterations as in them are made by our  
further Conditions bearing date the fourth day  
of December sixteen hundred and ninety four,  
Together also with the alterations made by our  
instructions bearing date at London the twelfth  
day of September Seventeen hundred and twelve  
and registered in our Secretary's Office of our said  
Province, Together with a Paragraph of our In-  
-structions bearing date at London the fifteenth  
day of December Seventeen hundred and thirty  
-eight and registered in our Land Office, We Do  
therefore hereby grant unto him the said Edward  
Talbot all that tract or parcel of land called  
"Talbot's Slavery", lying and being in the County  
aforesaid, Beginning at a bounded Red Oak  
being the third bounded tree of a tract of land  
called "Parrott's Delight" and running thence  
South South West fifty eight perches, East South  
East one hundred and thirty four perches, South

twenty eight degrees West sixteen perches, South

=ning, containing and laid out for one hundred  
and seven acres more or less, According to the Cer=  
=tificate of Survey thereof taken and returned into  
our Land Office bearing date the seventh day of  
April Seventeen hundred and fifty nine, and  
there remaining together with all rights, profits, bene=  
=fits and privileges thereunto <sup>(Royal mines excepted)</sup> belonging, to have  
and to hold the same unto him the said Edward  
Salbot, his heirs and assigns forever, to be holden  
of us and our heirs as of our Manor of Baltimore in  
free and common Socage by fealty only for all  
manner of services, Yielding and paying therefore  
yearly unto us and our heirs at our receipt at  
our City of St. Mary's at the two most usual  
feasts in the year, <sup>(Viz<sup>t</sup>;</sup> the feast of the annun=  
=ciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint  
Michael the Archangel, by even and equal portions  
the rent of four shillings three pence half penny  
Sterling in Silver or gold, and for a fine upon every  
alienation of the said land or any part or parcel  
thereof one whole years rent in silver or gold or the  
full value thereof in such commodities as we  
and our heirs or such Officer Or officers as shall  
be appointed by us and our heirs from time to time  
to collect and receive the same shall accept in dis=  
=charge thereof, at the choice of us and our heirs  
or such Officer or Officers aforesaid. Provided that if  
the said sum for a fine for alienation shall not  
(be)

be paid unto us and our heirs or such Officer or  
Officers aforesaid before such alienation and the  
said alienation entered upon Record either in  
the Provincial Court or in the County Court  
where the same parcel of land lieth within one  
month next after such alienation, then the said  
alienation shall be void and of no effect. Given
