**BALTIMORE COUNTY, SC.**

On this *17<sup>th</sup>* day of *February* 1834, before me the Subscriber Register of Wills for Baltimore County, came *David Wilson* a *male Negro*; and with him also personally appeared *David Ridgely* who made oath on the Holy Evangely of Almighty God, that the said *Negro Wilson*

then present before me is one of the identical — *male slaves* who belonged to *Charles Ridgely of Hampton*, at the time of his decease; and that the said *Negro Wilson* has attained to the age of *twenty eight* years since the decease of the said *Charles Ridgely of Hampton*; and is at this time *Twenty nine* years of age and no more;—And that the said *Negro Wilson*

is one of the — *male slaves* who was manumitted and set free by the Codicil to the last Will and Testament of the said *Charles Ridgely of Hampton*; and the said Deponent further saith that the said *Negro Wilson* was raised in *Baltimore* County.
