BALTIMORE COUNTY, SC.

On this *2^d* day of *February* 1835, before me the Subscriber Register of Wills for Baltimore County, came *Mary Moor* a *female Negro*, and with her also personally appeared *David Ridgely* who made oath on the Holy Evangely of Almighty God, that the said *Negro Mary* then present before me is one of the identical *female* slaves who belonged to *Charles Ridgely of Hampton*, at the time of his decease; and that the said *Negro Mary* has attained to the age of *twenty five* years *since the decease* of the said *Charles Ridgely of Hampton*; and is at this time *and also months* *Twenty five* years of age and no more;—And that the said *Negro Mary* is one of the *female* slaves who was manumitted and set free by the Codicil to the last Will and Testament of the said *Charles Ridgely of Hampton*; and the said Deponent further saith that the said *Negro Mary* was raised in *Baltimore* County.
