On this 21st day of June 1837, before me the Subscriber Register of Wills for Baltimore County, came Sam. Howard a male Negro, and with him also personally appeared James Tucker who made oath on the Holy Evangely of Almighty God, that the said Negro Sam then present before me is one of the identical - male slaves who belonged to Charles Ridgely of Hampton, at the time of his decease; and that the said Negro Sam has attained to the age of twenty eight years since the decease of the said Charles Ridgely of Hampton; and is at this time Thirty years of age and no more;—And that the said Negro Sam is one of the male slaves who was manumitted and set free by the Codicil to the last Will and Testament of the said Charles Ridgely of Hampton; and the said Deponent further saith that the said Negro Sam was raised in Baltimore County.
