On this 26th day of March 1839, before me the Subscriber Register of Wills for Baltimore County, came Ann Potter a female Negro, and with her also personally appeared John Ridgely who made oath on the Holy Evangely of Almighty God, that the said Negro Ann then present before me is one of the identical female slaves who belonged to Charles Ridgely of Hampton, at the time of his decease; and that the said Negro Ann has attained to the age of twenty five years since the decease of the said Charles Ridgely of Hampton; and is at this time thirty years of age and no more;—And that the said Negro Ann is one of the female slaves who was manumitted and set free by the Codicil to the last Will and Testament of the said Charles Ridgely of Hampton; and the said Deponent further saith that the said Negro Ann was raised in Baltimore County.
