MICHAEL ELINE

The following report addresses the defendant's rehabilitative mental health needs and is not meant to reflect guilt or innocence. These conclusions are based on observations of the defendant's condition at the time of the evaluation and, therefore, should not substitute for judicial assessment of behavior manifested at the time of any court appearances.

Mr. Michael Eline is a 36 year old white male charged with kidnapping, assault with intent to murder, and related offenses. He was seen at the Baltimore County Detention Center where he is being held in lieu of posting \$75,000 bail. Additional information was obtained from a telephone contact with his brother. At the time of the alleged offenses Mr. Eline explained that he was under the influence of alcohol and drugs. He stated that he was not hearing voices or having unusual or strange thoughts but did acknowledge some change in his judgement and impulse control. He stated that the charges were not reflective of his intent which was to reestablish a relationship with his former girl friend. At the time of the alleged offenses he was employed as a regional service manager, lived with a roommate in Silver Spring and was not symptomatic for any serious psychopathology.

On examination, Mr. Eline is a 36 year old white male who was neat in appearance and displayed no bizarre behavior or peculiar mannerisms. He was friendly and maintained good eye contact. Speech was coherent, relevant and goal directed. He answered questions promptly and displayed an adequate range of vocabulary. His mood was characterized by an almost inappropriate lack of concern about the present situation. He was cheerful, friendly, animated, and showed no blunting of affect or narrowing of emotional fluctuations. The content of his responses was characterized by logical answers which showed an adequate comprehension of questions. His style of response seemed characterized by minimization of the seriousness of his situation and some denial of the extent of his substance abuse. There was no evidence of psychotic thought content or cognitive impairment.

The evaluation indicates that Mr. Eline has a history of substance abuse with both drugs and alcohol. There was no evidence of other serious psychopathology. The evaluation further indicates that he is competent under the law. If Mr. Eline is released on bail then follow-up treatment for substance abuse is recommended and that can be obtained at Palmer Park Counseling Center by contacting Tom Harvard (1-772-5414) or the Suitland DICAP Counseling Center by contacting Rob Hordan (1-899-2940).







MOTION FOR DISCOVERY AND INSPECTION

Now comes the Defendant, Michael Francis Eline, by and through Counsel, and respectfully moves this Court pursuant to Rule 4-263 of the Maryland Rules of Procedure and the Common Law, to order the State of Maryland to permit defense counsel to inspect, copy, photograph or subject to scientific analysis any tangible objects requested below in the possession, custody or control of the State of Maryland, the existence of which is known, or by the exercise of due diligence may become known to the attorney for the State of Maryland, and additionally to order the issuance of a subpoena duces tecum requiring the production of the tangible objects and documents and statements requested below, and in addition counsel prays for any order requiring the State to answer the following:

1. Kindly set forth whether any property was seized or taken from the Defendant, along with the manner and method by which any property was seized or taken from the Defendant and whether such seizure was accomplished as a result of the issuance of a warrant.

2. Kindly produce and allow Defendant to inspect and review all tangible items of evidence which the States proposes to use in this cause, including but not limited to weapons, clothing, money, fingerprint exemplars, etc.

3. Kindly produce and allow defense counsel to examine any and all pictures or photographs, either still or moving pictures, taken by the State pertaining to the substance of the alleged crime.

4. Kindly produce for inspection and/or copying by Defendant's counsel, any books, papers, documents and tangible objects obtained from or belonging to the Defendant, obtained from others, which the State intends to use at the trial in this cause.

5. If any tangible objects were obtained from any person or persons, other than the Defendant, kindly set forth the name or names, of such person or persons, their addresses, and the place where such objects were obtained and the manner by which such objects were obtained.

6. Kindly identify and produce for examination, inspection, and/or copying any other documents, books, records, or tangible items which the Government intends to offer at the trial of this cause and which the Government contends, shows or demonstrates criminality and/or is inculpatory of the Defendant.

7. Please produce for inspection, copying, or photographing, all FBI, Bureau of Prisons and other Governmental records, including records of Federal, State and local penal institutions, pertaining to any Defendant, named or unnamed

alleged accomplices or co-conspirators, and all other persons the Government plans to call as witnesses in this case.

8. Kindly set forth, or alternatively allow counsel to hear, any police tapes or transmissions involved in this offense, which pertain to, or are relevant to the commission of said crime, the identification of the perpetrator of the alleged crime, the capture of the Defendant or any other relevant matter.

9. Kindly submit copies of all written, oral or recorded statements or written, oral or recorded confessions or admissions whether reduced to writing or not, or summarized in police reports or not, made by this Defendant, which the State proposes to produce as evidence in this case. This request includes but is not limited to any alleged conversations by the Defendant with any person who claims to have overheard the Defendant in any conversation.

10. Kindly submit the substance of any and all written, oral or recorded statements, confessions or admissions which may have been overheard by any person during the commission of the alleged crime and the name and address of said person or persons.

11. Kindly set forth any statement or the substance of any statement made by any alleged co-defendant or alleged accomplice or alleged co-conspirator which the Government contends implicates this Defendant. Indicate in this respect, the date said statement was made and the circumstances under which it was made. Indicate the names and addresses of each witness who

claims to have knowledge which supports the answer to this inquiry.

12. Kindly set forth the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all witnesses the State intends to call at the trial, and the names and addresses of all individuals other than those persons the State intends to call as witnesses who may have information pertaining to this case, including, but not limited to, names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all persons, including officers of the police department, who were present at any time when the complaining witness or any other witness viewed, was confronted with, or was in the presence of, the Defendant in connection with this case.

13. Identify by name and address, all persons who, during the investigation of this cause, had been offered immunity, favorable consideration, lesser pleas or other agreements in return for testimony, information or documents. This request applies to all statements made by Government agents or investigators that if any person did not fully cooperate with the Government that they would have difficulties or would be Defendants in any action. Indicate the name and address of each witness who claims to have the knowledge which supports the answer to this inquiry.

14. Kindly set forth the records of the office of the State's Attorney and/or the county or state police pertaining to the criminal activity, arrest and/or conviction of any and all witnesses the State intends to call in this case.

15. Kindly set forth the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all persons who have knowledge pertaining to this cause, or who have been interviewed by Government agents in connection with this case, but who were not called before the Grand Jury.

16. Kindly set forth the written or recorded statements or the substance of any statements, including Grand Jury testimony, of all persons who have been interviewed by Government agents who the Government does not plan to call as witnesses.

17. Kindly submit the recorded Grand Jury testimony of any named or unnamed alleged accomplice or accessory in this cause, as well as the Grand Jury testimony made on behalf of the Defendant, by the Government, and the testimony of any agent or employee of the Defendant.

18. Kindly set forth a list of all complaints made by the complaintant or made on his behalf to the police or State's Attorney's office of any alleged crimes having been committed by this Defendant.

19. Kindly submit all photographs of possible suspects shown by officers of the police department or any other Governmental agencies to the complaining witness or any other witness in connection with this case through which an identification was made.

20. Kindly furnish the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all persons having any knowledge whatsoever of the

substance of the crime alleged, who the State does not plan to call as a witness.

21. Kindly submit copies of all reports of physical or mental examinations, or scientific tests or experiments made in connection with this case, including but not limited to:

- A. Copies of all ballistic reports,
- B. Copies of all autopsies,
- C. Reports of any examinations of clothing worn by the Defendant as well as any reports pertaining to fingerprints, clothing, hair fibers, guns, bullets, blood or other evidence of a scientific nature which the State has in its possession or in the possession of any state agency.

22. Please produce a copy of the records showing the number of grand jurors present during the presentation of the charges against the Defendant, the record showing the number of grand jurors at the time the indictment was voted and the record of the vote on the indictment.

23. Kindly provide a copy of the record showing the number of grand jurors present, and every other person present during the days that there was a presentation of the charges against this Defendant.

24. Kindly furnish a copy of the Grand Jury transcript and proceedings, including and all minutes, notes and recordings of the Grand Jury which resulted in the indictment of this Defendant.

25. Kindly state the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all persons who testified before the Grand Jury as to the wrongdoing of this Defendant.

26. Please set forth the name, and address of any informer, who may possibly have in his possession, knowledge or control, any useful evidence which would indicate the innocence of the Defendant, or which would lessen the risk of false testimony, or which would be essential to a proper disposition of the case.

27. Please set forth the name, address and phone number of any informer, through whom information was derived which culminated in a search, wither with or without a search warrant, or whose information culminated in an arrest, either with or without an arrest warrant.

28. Please furnish counsel with a copy of any statements made by any witness, or if no copies, then the substance thereof, made by such witness at a line up, show up, photographic display, etc., at which an identification of the defendant was attempted by the state.

29. Kindly furnish the Defendant with a copy of any medical reports that the state wishes to introduce into evidence or medical reports that the state has which they do not wish to introduce into evidence with respect to this case or cases, stating the dates, names of physicians, addresses, etc.

30. Kindly furnish the Defendant with a copy of the arrest warrant and the affidavit thereto, under which he was arrested.

31. Kindly furnish the Defendant with a copy of the chain of custody of the Defendant from the time of his arrest until the time of the taking of any alleged statements or confessions from him, including the names and addresses of all persons who may have custody.

32. Kindly furnish the Defendant with a copy of any search and seizure warrant, and the affidavit attached thereto, which were issued in this case for the purpose of searching the Defendant, his residence or other property.

33. Pursuant to Brady v. Maryland, 373 U.S. 83 (1963), kindly produce and/or set forth:

a. All evidence in the Government's possession or under its control which is favorable to the defense or which may arguably prove helpful to the defense.

b. All evidence in the possession or control of the police or other State Agents which is arguably favorable or helpful to the defense, including but not limited to any evidence which is merely impeaching of Government witnesses.

c. Any evidence which would tend to undermine the credibility of prosecution witnesses including but not limited to any witnesses record of criminal convictions.

d. Any witness who was unable to identify the accused as the perpetrator of the crime, or who was unsure, at any time, of the perpetrator's identity.

e. Any witness who was interviewed who may have indicated a disbelief in the accused's guilt or who may have

asserted the accused's reputation for good character, honesty, gentleness, etc.

f. The names of any witnesses who have testified either falsely or erroneously.

g. In respect to this offense, the tapes and logs of police radio calls.

h. The names and addresses of all other persons investigated as the possible wrongdoer.

i. All evidence which the police or prosecution has which is arguably conflicting.

j. Specify what incentives, promises or suggested considerations have been made to any possible witness or his counsel.

k. Any facts or evidence which the police or prosecution has which would arguably reflect unfavorably on any witness.

l. All witnesses interviewed by the police who the state does not call as a witness, specifying the reason they are not called.

m. The location of any written memoranda by the police, pertaining to this offense for any person to be called as a witness.

As the basis for his Motion, the Defendant states that the objects requested are material and necessary to the preparation of his defense for the following reasons:

1. That the confessions, or admissions or statements of the Defendant are needed in order for defense counsel to properly advise the Defendant, and to prepare for trial.


2. That the confessions or admissions of co-defendants, accomplices, and accessories before and after the fact which implicate or incriminate the Defendant concerning removal, consolidation, severance, or other matters necessary to insure the Defendant of a fair trial.

3. That the names, addresses and statement of the witnesses whom the state intends to call to prove its case in chief are necessary to allow the Defendant to know the persons who are to testify against him and what they have said, and to be able to interview them, and to be aware of any material deviation in their testimony on the witness stand, and to protect him from surprise.

4. That the inspection, photographing, or copying of material in the possession of the State, or its agents, which may be exculpatory, or which may be helpful to the Defendant in cross-examination, is necessary to insure the Defendant of a fair and impartial trial, and to prevent the State from retaining information in its possession which would be helpful in throwing light on the issues of the case favorable to the Defendant.

5. That the materiality and necessity for inspection of all other items requested will be demonstrated when said items have been identified; the authority for their discovery is in Rule 4-263 of the Maryland Rules of Procedure.



DESCRIPTION OF PRESENT OFFENSE

The Baltimore County Crime Report reveals that on April 28, 1986, the defendant, after asking his former girlfriend for assistance with his car, kidnapped her in Baltimore County at gunpoint, forced her to drive to an isolated area near the Howard County - Montgomery County line and held her captive. While walking through a wooded area with her, he advised he "owed some guys a lot of money" and, if she did not cooperate, she would be hurt. After advising her he intended to hold her hostage, he tied her up, gagged her and put a blindfold over her eyes. When she tried to escape, he caught her and at one point strangled her into unconsciousness. When she recovered, he advised her he would make it up to her and thereafter he drove her home. The victim thereafter notified the police and certain incriminating evidence was discovered at the scene before the defendant was arrested.

The State, according to the prosecuting attorney, is seeking incarceration but no specific time is recommended.

STATEMENT OF DEFENDANT

The defendant reports that he committed this crime while under the influence of alcohol and drugs. While attending a party at his parents' home, he drank beer over a seven or eight hour period and, after smoking some Pot and snorting up to a gram of Cocaine, he became intoxicated. He then left the party and proceeded to Silver Spring, Maryland, forty-five minutes away, and along the way got "this crazy idea" about going by his old girlfriend's house (the victim) and getting her to go somewhere with him. He also thought he would "get her attention" by "scaring" her. In short, he loved her and this was his rather absurd way of showing it. It was only when the drugs and alcohol started wearing off that he realized how ridiculous his efforts were. He also reports coming to his senses after becoming frightened when she passed out as he strangled her. Despite this, he reports that he did not strike the victim or assault her in any other manner.

In retrospect, the defendant deeply regrets his behavior and he is hopeful that the psychiatric and psychological reports, aside from showing he was sane at the time, will also show that he is not a threat to the community generally or the victim specifically.

The defendant has been driving since he was seventeen and his license at present is valid with no known charges pending.

INSTITUTIONAL/PAROLE AND PROBATION HISTORY

The defendant served about thirty months of the fifteen year sentence before being paroled on 6/29/71. While in custody, he served time at the Diagnostic Center, Maryland Correctional Institution and Maryland Classification Training Center. The major benefit of this experience was that it allowed him to further his education by attending college and securing a degree. As for the crimes which resulted in his confinement, he reports he got in with a bad crowd at the time and he and two other subjects held up a number of gas stations.

As for supervision, the defendant's case was scheduled to expire in 1984 but, due to satisfactory performance while on parole, supervision was terminated on 1/18/77.

PERSONAL HISTORY

The defendant is from a family of four children and he was raised in West Baltimore and the Dundalk area of Baltimore County. His father is a retired foreman from Sparrows Point and his mother is a homemaker.

The defendant describes his family as basically "blue collar" and he believes shift work and family responsibilities made his father argumentative and abusive when he drank. Often times, he took this abuse out on his wife and the defendant now believes his father in fact had an alcohol problem. As for his siblings, he has a thirty-three year old retarded sister and two brothers who reportedly have had minor problems with the law.

The defendant married Patricia Brewer in Silver Spring, Maryland in 1973 and there is one child, a daughter, age eleven who presently lives with her mother in Ellicott City. The couple has been separated since 1977 and, since then, the defendant has fathered a son, now, age four, by his former common-law girlfriend, Linda Offutt. Social Services in Montgomery County collects child support in that case and the defendant, while reporting a civil relationship with his estranged wife, admits he is in arrears with his daughter's support.

PERSONAL HISTORY (continued)

The defendant cannot cite any specifics as to why he and his wife separated but he is now moving to secure a divorce so he can marry the woman he was involved with shortly before he became involved with the victim. As for the victim, he reports they lived together several months in the Summer of 1985 and broke up because he apparently was ambivalent about his feelings toward his current girlfriend.

The defendant's wife was interviewed on November 20, 1986 and she believes he was somewhat overwhelmed with family responsibilities when the separation occurred nine years ago. As a christian school teacher with deep religious convictions, she remains "committed" to the marriage and, even now, she would take the defendant back if the opportunity presented itself. She knows the chances are slim at this time, considering his common-law relationship, but she is convinced fate will eventually bring them together. Mrs. Eline has been "understanding" about the child support arrearages because she realizes he has a lot of pressure on him. He does not spend as much time with his daughter who had cystic fibrosis when she was younger, as he use to but their time together is viewed as quality time. Mrs. Eline also believes her husband is basically "a very gentle man" but that he has been hurt numerous times over the years by various individuals he has been close to. She also speculates that he is "terrified" over the prospect of going to jail since his prior experience in jail as a young man was extremely traumatic and may have created a situation where he needs to prove himself with women. As for any current drug activity, she is not aware of any but she believes he has some insecurities that may require professional attention.

EDUCATION

The defendant, while in custody at the Maryland Correctional Institution - Hagerstown and the Maryland Correctional Training Center, secured an Associates of Arts Degree and, thereafter, between 1971-73, he secured additional college credits at the University of Maryland. He therefore estimates he has the equivalent of three years of college. In addition thereto, he has pest control experience and he is certified as an exterminator.

Mr. Barry Cohen, Vice-President of Operations for Home Exterminating, was interviewed on 11/20/86 and he verified the dates of employment. He also provided a very favorable report on the defendant and he characterizes him as "dedicated and dependable." He also stated that the defendant is well liked by the customers and, because of his outstanding performance to date, he has already received a promotion and he is in line for handling a big out of State contract.

Mr. Michael Connell, Branch Manager at Orkin Exterminating Company, was interviewed on 11/21/86 and he verified the employment dates and provided a favorable report. The defendant presented no problems "whatsoever" while employed but this case and his record forced a decision for him to seek employment elsewhere.

HEALTH (PHYSICAL AND MENTAL)

The defendant reports his general health as excellent and there are no physical disorders at this time.

As for substance abuse, the defendant reports that he started smoking Pot for recreational use while at the University of Maryland in 1971-72 and, although he stopped for awhile, the activity resumed after he and his wife separated in 1977. He states that he used both Pot and Cocaine, mostly on weekends, and, at its worst period, he was spending \$200 a week to support a drug habit. He also reports he stopped using Cocaine altogether in 1980 and did not use it again until the day this crime was committed.

HEALTH (PHYSICAL AND MENTAL)

As noted, alcohol was a factor in this case, as well as other drugs, and the defendant readily admits that he has used alcohol to excess on occasion in the past.

There is no history of treatment but the defendant reportedly was evaluated by Dr. Spodak while incarcerated in this case and he also reports going to Eastern Regional Health Center in August, 1986 on his own and both reports have been requested and shall be forwarded or attached. There are also character reference letters attached as well as a letter from the victim to the defendant dated 9/23/85.





EVALUATION

The defendant stands convicted of Kidnapping and Attempted Murder and he now awaits sentencing. The victim in this case is a former girlfriend and the defendant blames his bizarre behavior on the influence of drugs and his continuing love for her at the time.

The victim, according to the police report, was abducted at gun point and, after being taken to an isolated area was apparently strangled until unconscious. The victim shortly thereafter regained consciousness and the defendant, after manufacturing a story about owing money "to some guys," apologized for his behavior and took the victim home. He now expresses deep regret for his poor judgment and he is certain he now has his head on straight and that his ambivalent feelings about whom he loves have now been clarified.

The defendant's criminal record reveals that he served about thirty months of a fifteen year sentence after being involved in what he admits was a series of gas station robberies. Supervision was terminated early in 1977 because of his satisfactory adjustment but it is apparent, based on his own comments that he continued using drugs both while on parole (1971-72) and thereafter on occasion up to 1980 when he reports he last used Cocaine. He also admits to episodic excessive drinking in the past and, as noted, alcohol was combined with drugs in this case. He denies any current alcohol drug abuse but, inasmuch as he is not in treatment or being monitored, one cannot be certain about what he might be doing in this area at present.

The defendant is separated from his wife, behind on his child support payments for his daughter, current on his child support payments for his son, born to a former common-law relationship, and, at present, plans to marry his current common-law girlfriend, Lydia Smith.

The strongest, most positive area of the defendant's life appears to be his employment where, according to his employer, he functions extremely well. He is "dedicated and dependable" and it is apparent his employer is anxious to keep him on the job notwithstanding his "legal" problems.

The defendant also is hopeful the Court will consider probation but, given the bizarre nature of this case, the terror and personal injury, both physical and emotional, sustained by the victim, plus his drug activity and criminal record, community supervision appears totally inappropriate. Accordingly, the defendant should be sentenced within the Maryland Sentencing Guidelines.

The night he came to my apartment, he asked for help and for trying to help him, I almost lost my life. He had everything planned because he had everything he used in his overnight bag. It was all senseless and I feel he should pay for what he did. I have never had to take sleeping pills in my entire life or blood pressure pills. I was told by the Doctor that anxiety from this event would very easily cause high blood pressure.







Mr. Michael Eline is a 36 year old white male charged with kidnapping, assault with intent to murder, and related offenses. He was seen at the Baltimore County Detention Center where he is being held in lieu of posting \$75,000 bail. Additional information was obtained from a telephone contact with his brother. At the time of the alleged offenses Mr. Eline explained that he was under the influence of alcohol and drugs. He stated that he was not hearing voices or having unusual or strange thoughts but did acknowledge some change in his judgement and impulse control. He stated that the charges were not reflective of his intent which was to reestablish a relationship with his former girl friend. At the time of the alleged offenses he was employed as a regional service manager, lived with a roommate in Silver Spring and was not symptomatic for any serious psychopathology.

On examination, Mr. Eline is a 36 year old white male who was neat in appearance and displayed no bizarre behavior or peculiar mannerisms. He was friendly and maintained good eye contact. Speech was coherent, relevant and goal directed. He answered questions promptly and displayed an adequate range of vocabulary. His mood was characterized by an almost inappropriate lack of concern about the present situation. He was cheerful, friendly, animated, and showed no blunting of affect or narrowing of emotional fluctuations. The content of his responses was characterized by logical answers which showed an adequate comprehension of questions. His style of response seemed characterized by minimization of the seriousness of his situation and some denial of the extent of his substance abuse. 2. Michael Eline is a 36 year old white male currently living with his girlfriend, Lydia and her two daughters. Michael's parents are together, father retired Bethlehem Steel foreman. Patient oldest of 4, 2 brothers, 1 sister. Sister, (33), is M.R. and living at parents. Brother, Dan (30), is "the grasshopper"; drugs, drifts, lives at parents about 1/2 time. Brother Jim (25) is "the nice boy", occasional drugs, lives at home. Patient says he is thought of as "the intellectual" because he went to college. He is about 30 credits shy of B.A. He was a jock, in college prep courses, getting A's and B's until about last half of 12th. He then started to hang around with a bad bunch. Speech was coherent, relevant and goal directed. He answered questions promptly and displayed an adequate range of vocabulary. His mood was characterized by an almost inappropriate lack of concern about the present situation. He was cheerful, friendly, animated, and showed no blunting of affect or narrowing of emotional fluctuations. The content of his responses was characterized by logical answers which showed an adequate comprehension of questions. His style of response seemed characterized by minimization of the seriousness of his situation and some denial of the extent of his substance abuse. There was no evidence of psychotic thought content or cognitive impairment.

The evaluation indicates that Mr. Eline has a history of substance abuse with both drugs and alcohol. There was no evidence of other serious psychopathology. The evaluation further indicates that he is competent under the law. If Mr. Eline is released on bail then follow-up treatment for substance abuse is recommended and that can be obtained at Palmer Park Counseling Center by contacting Tom Harvard (1-772-5414) or the Suitland DICAP Counseling Center by contacting Rob Hordan (1-899-2940).





Knowing Mike Eline for quite some time, I felt that I must write to you to plea for a sentence reduction.



Honorable Judge Hennegan,

Please except my letter of petition for sentence modification in regards to case # 86CR3535 involving Miss Cynthia Kennedy. I wish to express a deep remorse for having offended her and her family. This sorrow has continued since the events took place last April. My arrest, lost of career with Orkin Exterminating Co, embarrassment to my family and financial expense do not compare with the hurt that has occurred inside me due to my actions towards Miss Kennedy. I admitingly plead guilty to these events, realizing that the decisions that were made that evening were wrong thinking, regardless of the misuse of alcohol and drugs.

There are and have been, no feelings of animosity towards Miss Kennedy, her family, or the court. My actions stemmed forth from a broken relationship between Miss Kennedy and myself that kept me in a state of confusion for several months. There was a time in the fall of 85 that we lived together, met each others parents and discussed future plans of moving together to New Jersey. These plans fell apart due to my lack of a firm commitment because of my continued thoughts of my previous fiancée, Miss Lydia Smith. There are also other events that kept our relationship in a confused state.

My thoughts at the time of going to Miss Kennedy's house were to resolve this conflict of trying to love two women. My actions were wrong and so was my thinking. Driving her home, apologizing, and trying to explain

my feelings were in vain. There were additional events.

Two things I learned from these events. First, you can not force someone to love you. Love can not be based on physical attractiveness alone. You must have a firm commitment to each other combining your intellectual interests and spiritual interests. Our relationship lacked these ingredients. Second, responsibility can not be attained with the use of alcohol and drugs. These substances are detrimental to a person's ability to make mature decisions. I have since realized that my character was lacking in these understandings.

I have found my true love to be for Miss Lydia Smith based on a love of God and his principles. We married on this basic bond and one of mutual interest. I am now also realizing and experiencing the value of professional help here at Roxbury Institution. A continued relationship with my family and church and professional counseling will go a long way towards my continued personal growth.

There are family members whose love for me is suffering due to my incarceration. My wife and stepchildren continue their support for me. My son who is five and daughter who is eleven miss the support of their father even tho it was usually on a monthly basis. My mother is having problems at home without my support. My father had a heart problem and a cancer operation recently and my mentally retarded sister who lives at home is becoming unmanageable partially

I am writing to you on behalf of a certain friend of mine - namely one Mike Elvén. Some time ago I was contacted and told that he was arrested and charged with kidnap and attempted murder. I was shocked. This may take some explaining so bear with me.

I met Mike through the Amway business years ago. We became fast friends after we found out we liked the same things; sports, music, etc. We were always there for each other in many ways. Mike is the Godfather of my son, and his daughter Christie was born shortly afterwards. Some time later (2 years or so) Mike's marriage fell apart. What was sad about it was Mike was doing all he could to accommodate his wife's wishes and yet she still left him. He went through changes after that; as

LONGER was he involved in Conway and
he had made new friends, so I began
seeing less of him. But he would
always stay in touch and was as kind
and considerate as ever. Then some years
later he found himself in a financial
bind. He had been trying a lot of
different jobs none which satisfied him.
I put him up at my house for a
few days while he tried to find a
job. He heard from a friend at ORKIN
who was more than willing to give
him his old job back. Apparently he
held Mike in high esteem. So Mike
was working again but again going
through problems. He had a child by
one of his girl friends and he was
doing his darndest to give them a
good life. In return, he, in my
opinion, was treated like dirt. I
knew it hurt him but he would
always try to help them despite all

this. When his first wife and daughter moved to Texas to join some religious movement. This hurt Mike because he and his daughter had become very close. Now he would not be able to see her. I know that hurt, but, once again, he accommodated them as best he could.

Then later the news came to me about Mike's arrest. Being a cop I ~~did~~ looked into it a little contacting people who knew. They told me the charges were ridiculous, and said it would be seen for what it really was in court. Then Mike writes me and tells me he is getting 10 years. Time out!

I can only offer different stories of what really happened and I am sure you have heard them all. I cannot believe however, that try as we may as police officers, we can not get

convictions for drug dealers and rapists (the lowest scum of the earth in my opinion) and yet I see a friend of mine get a ten year sentence because the opposition put on such a good show. I am sorry your honor, but this is how I feel about the whole justice system. Forget who is innocent or guilty. It is a game between two parties and the best overall performance wins.



There is no way I can justify Michael's actions the night he perpetrated the offenses, and he undoubtedly deserves the sentence he received in return.



Please except my letter of petition for sentence modification in regards to case # 86CR3535 involving Miss Cynthia Kennedy. I wish to express a deep remorse for having offended her and her family. This sorrow has continued since the events took place last April. My arrest, lost career with Orkin Exterminating Co., embarrassment to my family, and financial expense do not compare with the hurt that has occurred inside of myself due to my actions towards Miss Kennedy. I admit^{ing}ly plead guilty to my actions, realizing that the decisions that were made that evening were wrong thinking, regardless of the misuse of alcohol and drugs.

There are and have been, no feelings of animosity towards Miss Kennedy, her family, or the court. My actions stemmed forth from a broken relationship between Miss Kennedy and myself. There existed a state of confusion in my mind about our relationship for several months. There was a time in the fall of 85 that we lived together, met each others parents, and discussed future plans of moving together to New Jersey due to a pending promotion. These plans fell apart due to my lack of a firm commitment because of my continued thoughts of my previous finacée,

Miss Lydia Smith. There are also other events that kept our relationship in a confused state.

My thoughts at the time of going to Miss Kennedy's house were to resolve this conflict of trying to love two women. My actions were wrong and so was my thinking. Driving her home, apologizing, and trying to explain my feelings were in vain. There were additional events.

Two things I learned from this experience. First, you can not force someone to love you. Love can not be based on physical attractiveness alone. You must have a firm commitment to each other, combining your intellectual interests and spiritual interests. Our relationship lacked these ingredients. Second, responsibility can not be attained with the use of alcohol and drugs.

These substances are detrimental to a person's ability to make mature decisions. I have since realized that my character was lacking in these understandings.

I have found my true love to be for Miss Lydia Smith. We married with a love based on a love of God and his principles and one of mutual interest. I am now also realizing and experiencing the value of professional help here at Roxbury Institution. A continued relationship with my family and church when I return home and professional counseling will go a long way towards my continued personal growth.

There are family members whose love for me are suffering due to my incarceration. My wife and new stepchildren have continued their support for me and miss my support at home. My real son, who is five and daughter who is eleven, miss the support of their father. Our monthly visits spent together this past year were irregular but very important. My mother is having problems at home and misses my support. My father has recently been hospitalized with a heart problem and last week had an operation for cancer. My sister who is retarded and lives at home is becoming unmanageable for my mother. This is partially due to the fact that ^{she} doesn't understand where I've went.

Home Exterminating Company is still reserving a position for me at this time. My Dept. of Agriculture license is contingent on attendance of yearly seminars and absence from the field will hurt my status.

I thank you for considering my letter and hope that your Honor will consider hearing me before his bench for sentence modification.

I am addressing this letter to you to thank you for being so considerate in the decision you made on sentencing my husband "Michael Eline" on March 10th, 1987. We all know that the sentence could have been worse and we thank you for lightening it. Also when you first saw Mike Oct 27th, 1986 and you set him free pending P.S.I., I want to thank you for that decision also. Sir I've never been through anything like this before in my life, so please try & be patient. I know your time is valuable & you are very busy, I appreciate taking time out to read this letter in hopes that you can understand better about Mike, please excuse my handwriting, I've had carpal tunnel surgery & a tumor removed from my wrist, but I'll try to be as brief & neat as possible. I don't know if this letter will help, I only hope & pray that it doesn't hurt. You see Judge Hennegan, Mike & I met in Dec. of 84, I was just coming out of a bad marriage and Mike & I went together steadily for a long time, then I was mixed up and confused because my ex-husband wanted to start seeing me & try to save our marriage

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so because of that, I broke up with Mike and he kept trying to come back to me & I felt so bad I told him to find someone else, well later is when he met Cindy Kennedy & they went together for a while, he moved in with her, they were getting along very well, even her parents liked Mike, they had invited him for dinner over their house, and Cindy & her parents went over Mike's mother's house, but Mike & I started missing each other very much & he broke up with Cindy to go back with me & Cindy kept writing Mike at his mom's every week, she kept calling him at work and at his mom's, she really wanted Mike to come back to her & Mike wouldn't do it, she was really confusing Mike. Mike did care for Cindy, I guess you could say after she wouldn't let up on the calling or the letters, that Mike started having mixed feelings, he was torn apart between both of us, so Mike thought he should get away for a while & move to Montgomery County with his friend Jim, but while Mike was gone, he kept in touch with me, and we both knew we made a mistake by not staying together. Mike & I meant so much to each other, and we had originally planned on getting married in Sept 1985, and God I wish we would have instead of waiting.

I loved Mike & he loved me and my daughters, he is such a good person. Judge Hennegan the day that this happened, he was so depressed, he didn't know what to do, well we all know he did something he should never have done, but he did something stupid, the cocaine, and he was going back to Montgomery County & stopped by Cindy's, & you know the rest, but your honor, he had no intentions of harming her, this incident was drug related, we all know how serious it is, if he hadn't been under the influence, none of this would have ever happened. If he meant her harm, he would not have taken her back home, he knew he was wrong, he knew he scared her, they drove back to Cindy's, she invited him in and they both sat in her apt. & talked & laughed a while & drank a beer together, and he apologized to her over & over again & she asked him to call her the next day, and two days later he was picked up.

Your honor I was thrown out of a car going 45 miles an hr. and I hit the ground so hard, I felt no pain, I felt a bunch a stings & I had to roll into a ditch to keep from being run over & killed, I was left there to die, I was kidnapped at gun point from a fast food restaurant. I have scars all over my body.

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I was petrified. Your honor, I know Cindy had to have been scared, that night, but she knows that Mike was not himself that horrible night, she too knew he was warm, loving, thoughtful & considerate or she would not have hated to lose him & try to get him to come back to her when he broke up w/ her to come back to me. Your honor Mike was wrong in what he did, but he didn't disfigure Cindy, he didn't kill her. When I got Mike out on bail, he got a good job right away, and we were together everyday since June 13, 1986 till March 10, 1987. He is an excellent provider, a terrific father, a super worker and a fantastic husband. Mike had only been separated for 10 years, he did not get his divorce till February and knowing that he could be sentenced your honor we loved each other so much that we both felt the best thing to do was to get married because of the love & faith we have in each other, we did. We didn't get married for no other reason. If Mike was the awful man that Cindy is accusing him of being, I would be scared to anything of Mike & I would not have married him. Your honor, I know Mike has a previous record, 18 years ago, but your honor, for 18-19 years, Mike had

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straighten out, he had an excellent job, a great big help to his mom & family and kept his record clean until this happened. Dear Sir, I hope you take all of this into consideration along with when you allowed Mike to come home on Oct 27, 1986, we continued to be together, he continued to work, & be a great person and did not contact Cindy in anyway, and I must tell you we were both scared of the outcome of this, Mike was really worried & scared he was and still is so sorry about what happened.

Its been two weeks today since Mike was sentenced, and I can only tell you that I'm so scared of Mike, that I can't sleep, I'm on nerve medicine now, ~ trying to cope & accept what has happened to him & wondering what will happen to him in the end, Everyone misses Mike & his help & my daughter & I feel so lonely without him, in essence you know, we need Mike, His dad also has cancer of the throat besides the malignant tumor on the side of his neck. His mom has her hands full with Mike's retarded sister who's 33, and his Boss & Co workers miss him. Things just aren't the same without Mike. I also had to withdraw my 16 year old daughter from

school so she could get more hours at work to try to help ends meet. I feel like I've lost Mike and now I feel like we are going to lose everything that we both worked so hard for. I know Mike wants to be coming home soon although I pray, very hard that something may change. And even though Mike has a job which he has been guaranteed when he does come back home or perhaps be put on work release, I wonder how long it will be before something better can happen. Your honor, I'm sorry to have written such a long letter, I don't know what to do, I'm just pouring out my heart on paper begging and pleading for mercy on my husband. Please, your honor, if you can just find it in your heart to help this sad situation we would all appreciate it, we just couldn't be thankful enough. We all love him miss him and need him and he needs us too.

It has been such a hardship for all of us in more ways than one since Mike has been sentenced. I'm trying my best to hold on and be strong for Mike and everyone else, but it is hard. I don't know how much longer I can continue to hold up not knowing what really is going to happen with Mike, with our family.

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I don't know what I'm going to do, I work & have a job with a medical equipment company, & my 16 year old only makes minimum wage & I don't make that much, and we are in a two year lease and I just don't know how I'm going to keep from losing our home, furniture & Mike & my sanity. I can't work 2 jobs, my health won't permit it, I've had breast cancer, & removal (Total Radical), 24 years ago a tumor removed from my liver thank God it was benign, and 2 months ago a tumor removed from my wrist thank God that was benign & I also have 2 more tumors that need to be biopsied & removed, I pray to God they will also be benign, one is the size of a pea & the other right next to it is larger than a pea. But financially I can't even afford to have this done, I have some insurance, but it doesn't have good coverage & I still owe Dr. Bills from my hand for the surgery. In spite of all these difficulties we are all having, I'm still thankful to God & to you for letting Mike come home on Oct 27, 1986 so we could have the chance for him to get his divorce so we could be married & be man & wife. Please you Honor, you have helped us so far, and we are very grateful to you for your help. Mike isn't eligible for parole for almost 24 years. as it stands now, I feel like I'm at a dead end, lost, you Honor, is there anyone else I could write to or talk to that may

be able to help Mike too if there is, please
Would you let me know. I'm sure you get
a lot of letters like mine. Again thank you for
your feelings & kindness you've shown us.
And thank you for reading this, I'm sorry
it was such a long letter. I understand Mike
