

John F. Waesche, Maria Edmonia Belt and John Belt, grand children of said intestate and the only children and heirs at law of his deceased daughter Ann Amelia Belt, who died before her said father - that the whole of said heirs at law reside in Frederick County and they are all adults, except said Maria E. & John Belt who are infants under the age of twenty one years, Your Orators further state that said real estate descended to said heirs at law of William Eagle that the same cannot be divided among said heirs at law without great injury & loss and that the interest of all said heirs at law, infants as well as adults, requires that said real estate shall be sold and the proceeds of sale distributed under the direction of your Honor among the parties entitled to the same according to the several rights. In tender consideration whereof & for that your Orators are remediless in the premises by the strict rules of the common law and relievable only in a Court of Equity, where matters of this nature are properly cognizable - To the end therefore that the said George W. Eagle and Sarah Jane Eagle his wife, Syceurgus Eagle, John F. Waesche and Margaret E. Waesche his wife, Maria Edmonia Belt and John Belt may answer the matters & things aforesaid, as fully as if the same were here again repeated and they thereunto particularly interrogated and that said real estate may be sold and the proceeds of sale distributed under the direction of your Honor among the parties entitled to the same and that your Orators may have all such other & further relief in the premises as the nature of the case may require & to your Honor shall seem meet: May it please your Honor to grant unto your Orators the State of Maryland's writ of Subpoena to be directed to the said George W. Eagle & Sarah Jane Eagle his wife, Syceurgus Eagle, John F. Waesche & Margaret E. Waesche his wife, Maria E. Belt & John Belt, all of Frederick County, thereby commanding them and each of them to be and appear before your Honor in your Honorable Court on a certain day therein to be named, to answer all and singular the premises and to stand to abide and perform such order & decree therein as to your Honor shall seem meet and your Orators will ever pray &c.

Exhibit No 1 - At the request of William Eagle the following deed was recorded Dec 17 1855 - "Stamp duty" E.S.
 This indenture made this ninth day of October in the year of our Lord 1855, between St George Tucker of the City of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania of the one part and William Eagle of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, of the other part, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven thousand, one hundred & eighteen dollars and ten cents current money, by the said William Eagle to the said St George Tucker in hand paid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which he doth hereby acknowledge, the said St George Tucker hath bargained and sold, aliened and enfeoffed, and by these presents doth give grant, bargain and sell, alien, enfeoff release convey and confirm unto the said William Eagle his heirs and assigns, all that tract or parcel of land, being part of Division number two (No 2) of the first (1st) part of lot number three (No 3) of a tract of land called "Carrollton" said Division No 2, being the land allotted to said St George Tucker in the Commissioners Return in No 2333 upon the Equity Docket of Frederick County Court - Situate, lying & being in Frederick County aforesaid, and contained within the following metes & bounds, courses and distances to-wit: Beginning at a large Stone planted at the end of Sixty two & Seven tenths (62 ⁷/₁₀) feet
