respectfully shew unto your Honor:-

First:-

That Columbus O'Donnell, who was the great grand-
father of your Orator, departed this life on
May 25th, A.D. 1873, having duly made and
published his last will and testament, consisting
of his Will of the date of August 24th, A.D. 1866
and three codicils thereto, which said Will was
duly admitted to Probate and is recorded in
the office of the Register of Wills for Baltimore City
in Liber I No. 39, folio 204, and your Orator
herewith files a Certified Copy of Article Second, of
said Will, which she and your Orator make a part
hereof, as if said Will were herin set forth:- Which

That by Article Second of said last will and
testament, the said Testator gave and devised
unto certain trustees therein, named, Viz:- Charles
Oliver O'Donnell, Adrian Selie and Cy Martin Pook
and Elliot O'Donnell Poor, and to their survivors
and the heirs, executors and administrators of such
survivor and their successor forever, his Country Place
called Mount O'Donnell, in Federal County and the
State of Maryland, containing about Three Hundred
and thirty acres more or less, in trust for the use
and benefit of the Testator's grand-son Columbus O'Don-
nell - the eldest son of the Testator's deceased son
Columbus O'Donnell Jr. - and at the death of the
