This deed of Trust, made this 15th day of April in the year Eighteen Hundred and Ninety eight by J. Frank Reid and Annie C. Reid his wife residents of Frederick County, Maryland and Mary C. Flood and Thomas A. Flood her husband residents of Salt Lake County, in the State of Utah the said Mary C. Flood being temporarily in Frederick County, State of Maryland:- Witnesseth that the said J. Frank Reid and Mary C. Flood his sister are indebted unto various persons in sums of money which they are at this time unable to pay in full and for other good and sufficient considerations unto them moving and desiring to convey their property as hereinafter described unto Outerbridge Horsesy, of Frederick County, Maryland in trust for the interest and purpose as hereinafter set forth have agreed to execute these presents, now therefore in consideration of the promises and the sum of one dollar, current money this date paid unto us by the said Outerbridge Horsesy, we the said J. Frank Reid and Annie C. Reid his wife and Mary C. Flood and Thomas A. Flood her husband do hereby grant and convey assign and make over unto the said Outerbridge Horsesy of Frederick County, Maryland all those lots, pieces or parcels of lots or parcels of land situate lying and being in the village of Knoxville in the County, of Frederick and State of Maryland described as follows, embracing all lots number sixteen and seventeen nearly all that lot known as the "Knop lot" and part of Lot number twenty-five beginning so as to include the whole in which in one general outline at a white flint stone formerly planted on the North Side of the main Street in Knoxville and at the South west corner of "Lot No. 18" and running thence (1) North 44 degrees West 16 and 46/100 feet to intersect the closing line of the deed from J. S. Morrison and wife to Henry C. Drill and with said line (2) North 55 and 1/2 degrees west 1, and 68/100 feet to the east of the third line of the deed from Henry C. Drill and wife to J. H.
