

NO. 8158 Equity.

2nd - That being seized as aforesaid the said Mary C. Frizzell departed this life intestate, during the month of May in the year A. D. 1903, and leaving surviving her as her heirs at law, in whom the aforementioned property vested as tenants in common, an adult son Raymond L. Frizzell, who is married and whose wife's name is Carrie M. An adult son Ira C. Frizzell who is married and whose wife's name is Mary N. An adult son Walter K. Frizzell, who is married and whose wife's name is an infant. Son Gordon B. Frizzell, who is the defendant in this cause. Subject however to the life estate or dower of her husband Bertha C. Frizzell, which was on the 31st day of October in the year A. D. 1903. Conveyed to your complainant Raymond L. Frizzell and is recorded in Liber A. D. N. No. 17, 719, a Certified Copy of which is herewith filed and marked exhibit No. 5, to this Bill of Complaint.

3rd - That a partition of said property among the said parties entitled thereto according to their several interests as aforesaid cannot be made save, without great loss or injury to them, the defendant being an infant makes it necessary to invoke the jurisdiction of your Honorable Court, to decree a Sale of said real estate.

To the end therefore - 1st. That a decree may be passed, by Your Honorable Court for the Sale of the real estate mentioned in these proceedings, and that the proceeds arising from said Sale may be distributed amongst the parties of interest according to their respective interests. 2nd. And for such other and further relief as the Justice of the Case may require.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your Complainants the writ of Subpoena directed to the infant defendant Gordon B. Frizzell, resident of Catonsville Baltimore County, Maryland, commanding him to be and appear in Your Honorable Court on some day certain answer the premises aforesaid by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.
