Herewith in part herof. marked "Exhibit No. 4."

9. That said land mentioned and described in Exhibits Nos. 2, 3 and 4 cannot be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested; and it would be of utmost and advantage to the parties entitled to have said land sold by a Trustee or Trustees, to be appointed by your Honorable Court, and the proceeds divided among the parties entitled thereto according to their respective rights; all of the parties interested being adults.

Therefore Your complainants pray your Honor for the following Relief:-

1. That a decree may be passed directing the land and premises mentioned in this Bill to be sold, by a Trustee or Trustees to be duly appointed by your Honorable Court and the proceeds arising from said sale divided among the parties entitled thereto according to their respective rights.

2. That your Complainants may have all such further and other relief as the nature of their case may require and as to your Honor shall seem just and right.

And Your complainants pray for the following process:- That Subpoena may issue out of your Honorable Court, directed to the said John L. Englar and Emma Englar, his wife, residents of Linwood, Carroll County, Maryland; Mamee Englar and Joseph Englar, her husband, residents of New Windsor, Carroll County, Md.; Carrie Englar, inmate confined in the Springfield Hospital an asylum for the insane located at Sykesville, Carroll County, Maryland; Margaret Englar unmarried residing in Baltimore City, Maryland; Wm. Englar and — Englar, his wife, residing in Union Bridge, Carroll County, Maryland commanding them and each of them to be and appear either in person or by solicitor in your Honorable Court, on some day certain to be named therein, and to answer the premises, abide by and perform such a decree as may be passed therein.
