Your Orators complaining say--

1. That your orators, Ellen Trail Legg, widow, Frederick Webster Legg, Ellen Trail Sellman, J. Archer Sellman and Florence Goldsborough Legg, are residents of Baltimore City, in the State of Maryland; and your orators Edgar Kent legg and Helen B. H. Legg, his wife, are residents of Washington City, in the District of Columbia.
2. That the defendants, Chauncey Morgan Legg, infant, and John C. Legg are residents of Baltimore City, in the State of Maryland; and the Defendant Corporation, The Fidelity and Deposit Company of Maryland, has its principal office located in Baltimore City, State of Maryland.
3. That Your oratrix, Ellen Trail legg, is the widow of Edgar K. Legg, Senior, wgo died onthe date September 29th in the year 1909.
4. That Frederick Webster Legg, Edgar Kent legg, Ellen Trail Legg, Florence Galdsborough Legg, and Chauncey Morgan Legg, are all of the children of your oratrix Ellen Trail Legg; and that all of said children are adults and over 21 years of age, excepting Chauncey Morgan legg, who is an infant 16 years of age.
5. That before her marriage to Edgar Kent Legg, Senior, your oratrix was ellen Trail Webster, the daughter of George F. Webster, of Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland, who died on the date December 8th in the year 1883.
6. That the said George F. Webster, father of Your oratrix, Ellen Trail Legg, left a last will and testament dated March 28th 1883, and which was wly admitted to probate by the Orphanas Court for Frederick County, Maryland, on the date December 17th 1883, and recorded in liber J P. P. No 1 folio 499, one of the will records in the office of the register of Wills for Frederick County Maryland, a duly certified copy of which will is herewith filed as a part hereof, and marked Exhibit A.
7. That according to the terms of said last will and testament of said George F. Webster, Exhibit A, said testator provides as follows--"I also give, will and bequeath to my daughter Ellen Trail Legg the entire income of my real estate, as long as she may live, at her death the real estate is to go to her child or children if she have mooo than one lineal descendant at the time of her death," as will appear by reference to said exhibit A.
8. That among other parcels of real estate the said George F. Webster, died seized and possessed of three certain lots or parcels of ground, situated lying and being continuous to each other in Frederick District, in Frederick County, State of Mryland, on the South side of the Baltimore and Frederick Turnpike road, between the monocoacy River on the East and the public road or lane
