TESTIMONY.

The defendants, Nannie S. Brown and H. R. Brown, her husband, having been duly warned by the Publication of an order of publication, as shown by the certificate of the publisher of "The News" a newspaper published in Frederick County, pursuant to a previous order of this Court, and said defendants having failed to appear thereto, it is hereupon, this 10th day of May A. D. 1914, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed that the plaintiffs are entitled to relief in the premises and that the Bill of Complaint be and the same is hereby taken pro confesso against the said defendants, Nannie S. Brown and H. B. Brown; but because it does certainly not appear to what relief the plaintiffs are entitled, and because some of the defendants are infants and unable to appear and answer by a guardian ad litem, it is hereby further adjudges, ordered and decreed that one of the standing Examiners of this Court take testimony to support the allegations of the Bill and also any other testimony which may be offered by any of the parties to this cause.

In pursuance of the annexed order of the court and notice given me by the Solicitor for the Plaintiffs, I Clayton O. Keedy, one of the standing examiners of said Court duly appointed, qualified and sworn having assigned the 14th day of May A. D. 1914, at my office in Frederick Maryland, as the time and place for taking the testimony in this case, and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned, did, at the appointed time and place proceed to take the following testimony to wit--

The Plaintiff filed with the examiner as evidence Exhibit No. 1 which is herewith returned by the examiner--

Thomas A. Simpson, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff being duly sworn and examined viva voce deposes and says as follows--

My name is Thomas A. Simpson, my age is 49 years and I reside in Libertytown Frederick County Maryland.

I knew Dr. S. Sollers Maynard, the decedent mentioned in these proceedings who was my mother's brother. He is dead; he died in Frederick, Frederick County on August 3rd 1913, and he left no will.

He left no real estate but the property in town here on West Second street mentioned in Exhibit No. 1 filed with the Bill.
