To the Honorable, the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity,

the Bill of Complaint, of Charles E. King and Mary C. King, his wife, J. Otis King and Nettie B. King, his wife, Albert E. King and Lela King, his wife, Bessie I. King, unmarried, Franklin S. King and May Anna King, his wife, respectfully shews unto your Honors:-

First;- That James Harrison King late of Frederick County, deceased, was in his life time and at the time of his death, seized and possessed of in fee simple of a lot, piece or parcel of land, situate lying and being in the Village of Urbana, Urbana District, Frederick County, Maryland, it being the same real estate conveyed to him by Edward G. Linthicum and Lillian G. Linthicum, his wife, by deed dated the 7th day of April, in the year 1906, and recorded in Liber S, T, N, No. 274, folio 318, one of the land records of Frederick County, all of which will appear, by reference to said deed which is herewith filed as a part hereof marked Exhibit, A, which together with all other exhibits herein produced it is prayed may be taken and Considered, as a part hereof of this Bill of Complaint.

Second- That being so seized and possessed the said James Harrison King departed this life in the month of August, ___ in the year A, D, 1907, leaving a last will and testament duly executed to pass real estate, in this State which said will has been admitted to probate in the Orphans Court for Frederick County, and is now on record in the Office of the register of Wills of the County, aforesaid, in Liber W, B. C. No. I, Folio 430, one of the Books of Record in said office, a certified Copy of which will is filed herewith and Marked Exhibit B.

Third- that after making provisions of the payment of his just debts, and funeral expenses, the said Testator Devised and bequeathed as follows-

I give and bequeath all my property both real and personal unto my wife, Mary E. King, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, so long as she remains my widow, but in the event that my widow should remarry then all my property both real and personal, shall be sold, after due notice and after my wifes thirds are taken out, the residue of my estate shall be equally divided Share and Share alike, among my four sons, and three daughters, with the Exception however of my son Franklin S, who having drawn his wages during the last two years, of his minority, shall on that account, receive two hundred dollars less, than any other of my heirs, And I Further direct that in case of my wife remains my widow, up to the time of her death, then all my property, both real and personal property, shall be sold after due notice, and the proceeds of my entire estate, after my debts are paid, shall be equally divided among my surviving heirs Share and Share alike, with the exception of my son Franklin S, who shall receive two hundred dollars less, than any of
