That the Nephews and Nieces to whom said interests in said real estate, are devised, according to the decision of your Honorable Court, in Construing said will in said cause, No, 9934 Equity, are the following.

- 8- Irl Henry Beall an infant who resides in Frederick County,
- 9- Lamora May Beall, an infant who resides in Frederick County,

of whom the first six, named above are the Children of Mary Alice, (Beall) Rensburg, a deceased sister of the testator, whose husband's name is Albert J, Rensburg, who is still living and a resident of the State of Pennsylvania,

That the Character of the Above described real estate, is such that the widow's one-third part. cannot be set apart, for her nor can it be divided among those to whom it is divided without loss and injury, and further that it will be to the benefit, and advantage to all who are interested therein, especially the infants, for the said real estate, to be sold and the proceeds of sale, divided between and among them as they are severally entitled to participate therein,

To the end, therefore,

1st That a decree may be passed for the sale of the said real estate.

2nd- That the proceeds of said sale, may be distributed Between your Orators, and the other parties entitled thereto, according as they are severally entitled, to participate therein, and

3rd- That your orators may have such other and further relief as their case may require,

Your Orators Humbly pray Your Honorable Court to grant unto them the writ of Subpoena, directed to the Sheriff of Frederick County, against Augusta A, Beall, widow, Violet Irene Beall, infant, Irl Henry Beall, infant, and Lamora May Beall, infant. the Writ of Subpoena directed to the Sheriff of Washington County, Against Charles F, W, Rensburg, and Margaret E, Rensburg, his wife, and order of publication directed against Alberta J, W, (Rensburg) Golden and George E, Golden her husband, Ira W, G, Rensburg, and Marharet May Rensburg, his wife, Henry B, Rensburg, and Virdie P, Rensburg his wife, Mary M. L. Rensburg O Staley and John A, Staley, her husband, and Florence D, M, Rensburg, unmarried, who are non-residents defendants and who reside in the state of Pennsylvania, Commanding them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court, on some day certain to be named therein in said writs, to answer the premises and to show cause, if any they have, why a decree Should not be Passed as prayed in the Above Bill of Complaint,
