3. That the said Amanda Gross being indebted as aforesaid unto your Petitioner and also unto divers other persons departed this life on or about the 27th day of May, A.D. 1924, leaving surviving her the following heirs at law: Nathaniel Gross, a brother; Josiah Gross, a brother, whose wife's name is Alice Gross; Jonas Gross, a brother, whose wife's name is Jennie M. Gross; and the following children and heirs at law of Susanna Gross Wise, a deceased sister; Emma Houser, whose husband's name is Charles Houser; Rena Houser, whose husband's name is Robert Houser; Katherine Kepler, whose husband's name is Robert Kepler; Charles M. Wise, whose wife's name is Edna Wise; Joseph H. Wise, whose wife's name is Sylvia Wise; Harry G. Wise, unmarried; Gertrude Doble, whose husband's name is Charles Doble; Edith Wise, unmarried; Fabbie Brandenburg, whose husband's name is George Brandenburg; Oliver Wise, whose wife's name is \_\_\_\_\_ Wise; John Wise, whose wife's name is Lola Wise, and the following children and heirs at law of Katherine Young, a sister; William Young, whose wife's name is Eva Young; Carrie Winsell, whose husband's name is Henry H. Winsell; Edith Hughes, a daughter of Estie Hughes, a daughter of said Katherine Young; Candace Pagan, whose husband's name is Chas. B. Pagan; all of whom are adults with the exception of Edith Hughes, who is an infant 14 years of age.

4. That your Petitioner is informed and believes that there is no personal estate of any value to discharge all the just debts due and owing by the said intestate, Amanda Gross, at the time of her death, and is advised that the real estate ought to be sold and the proceeds to be derived from the sale of the said real estate ought to be applied to the claim of your Petitioner as well as the claims of other creditors of the said Amanda Gross, as far as possible.

TO THE END THEREFORE;-

1. That the said real estate of the said Amanda Gross deceased may be sold for the payment of the aforesaid debts.

2. And that your orator may have such other and further relief as the case may require.

May it please your honors to grant to you orator an order of publication giving notice to the said Charles M. Wise and Edna Wise, his wife, whose address is 710 Park Ave, Piqua, Ohio; Joseph H. Wise and Sylvia Wise, his wife, whose address is Dayton, Ohio, R.R. No. 13, Box No. 506; William Young and Eva Young, his wife, whose address is 717 Hermosa Ave., Price Hill, Cincinnati, Ohio; Carrie Winsell and Henry H. Winsell, her husband, whose address is 618 Coffey St; Indianapolis, Ind; Edith Hughes, infant, whose address is 2500 Cheney St., Toledo, Ohio; and Candace Pagan and Chas. B. Pagan, her husband, whose address is Hamilton, Ohio, R.R. No. 1 Box 26; all of whom are non-residents of this State and all of whom are heirs of the said Amanda Gross; of the object and substance of this bill and warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before a certain day to be named therein, to show cause if any they have, why a decree ought to pass as prayed; and also the writ of subpoena directed unto the said Josiah Gross and Alice Gross, his wife; Jonas Gross and Jennie M. Gross, his wife; Fannie Brandenburg and George Brandenburg, her husband; Oliver Wise and \_\_\_\_\_ Wise his wife, John Wise and Lola Wise, his wife, all of Frederick County; to the said Emma Houser and Charles Houser, her husband, Rena Houser and Robert Houser, her husband; Katherine Kepler and Robert Kepler, her husband; Harry G. Wise, Gertrude Doble and Charles Doble, her husband; Nathaniel Gross; and Edith Wise, all of whom are residents of Washington County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear either in person or by solicitors in this Court on or before a certain day to be named therein to show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
