Knodle, whose husband's name is Harvey Knodle, and Florence Itnyre, whose husband's name is Charles Itnyre.

I have never known her to have any money or property with the exception of this real estate and I, of course, know that there are some bills contracted for her burial and I remember that she was sick for about two months and has doctor's attention constantly during that time.

She died not having any personal property or money that I know of with the exception of a few items of furniture which are virtually of no value. They might possibly be worth \$15.00 or \$20.00 The property will probably bring between \$300 and \$400.

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The above cause standing ready for a hearing, and being submitted, the Bill, Answer, Exhibits Testimony and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered .

It is thereupon, this 1st day of November in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-four by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered, and decreed, that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold, and that Leslie N. Coblenz, Esquire Jonas Gross and Josiah Gross of Frederick County, Be, and they are hereby appointed Trustees to make the said sales, and that the course and manner of their proceedings shall be as follows; they shall first filed in the Clerk's office of this Court, a BOND to the State of Maryland, executed by them with a surety, or sureties, to be approved by the Court, or the Clerk thereof, in the penalty of Eight Hundred Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in them by this decree, or which may be reposed in them by any future order, or decree in the premises, They shall then proceed to make sale of the said Real Estate, having first given at least three weeks previous notice, inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick County, and such other notice as they may think proper of the time, place, manner and terms of sale; which terms
