Richardson can be paid your Orators filed this Bill of Complaint in your Honorable Court to the end that the real estate of which the said Charles G. Richardson died seized and possessed, and described in "Exhibit A" maybe sold by Decree of your Honorable Court for the purpose of paying the claims of your Orators and the claims of all other creditors of said Charles G. Richardson, who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit.

Wherefore, your Orator pray:-

First: That your Orators will pass the decree of your Honorable Court directing the real estate of which said Charles G. Richardson died seized and possessed, and described in "Exhibit A" may be sold by a Trustee for the purpose of paying the claims of your Orators, and of any other creditors, if there be such of the said Charles G. Richardson, deceased.

Second: And for such other and further relief as your Orators may be entitled in the premises, and as unto your Honors will appear to be just and equitable.

Third: May it please your Honors to grant unto your Orators the writs of Subpoena directed to Maria Smith, Lottie Richardson, Elizabeth Valentine, Lottie Gardner, William Gardner, John Euppins, Edna Duppins, Alice Duppins, William Duppins, and Mazie Duppins all residents of Frederick County, Maryland, unto Annie Brown and Philemon Brown, residents of Baltimore County, Maryland; unto Clarence Duppins, Maggie Duppins, and Edna Richardson, residents of Baltimore City, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear either in person or by solicitor in your Honorable Court, on or before a certain date, to be named therein: to answer the Bill of Complaint and to show cause if any they have why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed. And that they may be granted the Order of Publication, directed to the Defendants, James Duppins, Gertie Duppins, Olevia Dixon, Bates Dixon, Perry Richardson, Anne May Richardson, William Richardson, Norman Richardson, Margaret Waters, and Waters, her husband, all of whom are residents of the City of Pittsburgh, State of Pennsylvania, and non-residents of the State of Maryland, giving them notice of the object and substance of this Bill, and warning them to be and appear in this Court, either in person or by Solicitor, on or before a certain day to be named therein, to show cause if any they have why a decree should not be passed as prayed.
