TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The bill of complaint, of the complainants in the above entitled cause, respectfully represents:

- 1. That Charles J. Barrick, late of Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, departed this life, intestate, on or about February 12, 1928, seized and possessed of the real estate hereinafter described, and left surviving him, as his only heirs at law, the following children:
- (a) Harry W. Barrick, a son, whose wife's name is Carrie Barrick, and both residing at Rocky Ridge, in Frederick County, Maryland.
- (b) Maurice V. Barrick, a son, whose wife's name is Ruth Barrick, residing in Hagers-town, Washington County, Maryland.
- (c) Grover E. Barrick, a son, whose wife's name is Emma L. Barrick, residing at Cavetown, in Washington County, Maryland.
- (d) George Dix Barrick, a son, who departed this life, in-testate, in the year 1933, sezied and possessed of an undivided one-fourth interest in said real estate, and left surviving him, as his only heirs at law, his widow, Emma J. Barrick, and the following children:- George Dix Barrick, Jr., Mary Ruth Barrick, Emma Jane Diefenbach, whose husband's name is Gordon Diefenbach, Robert N. Barrick, Katherine S. Barrick, and Nancy Louise Barrick, all residents of Baltimore City.
- 2. That, at the time of his death, the said Charles J. Barrick was seized and possessed of all that farm containing 269-3/4 acres of land, more or less, located in Creagerstown District in said Frederick County, Maryland, consisting of a part of a tract called "Krises Establishment", containing 253 acres, more or less, and a part of a tract called "Sixth Dividend", containing 16-3.4 acres, more or less, and being all of the same real estate described in the deed to said Charles J. Barrick, from Mary E. Diffendal and others, datedt March 14, 1894, and recorded in Liber J.L.J. Bo. 5, at folio 661, one of the land records for said Frederick County, and a certitified copy of said deed is filed herewith as part of this bill of complaint and marked "Exhibit A".
- 3. That said real estate is owned by the parties hereto, as tenants in common, and is operated as one farming enterprise, by the defendant, Harry W. Barrick.
- 4. That said real estate cannot be divided without loss and injury to the parties interested therein.

Wherefore your complainants pray for the following relief:

- (1) That a decree of Court may be passed for the sale of said real estate.
- (2) That a trustee or trustees may be apppinted to make such sale and distribute the proceeds.
