TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Bill of Complaint of Marian Webster Stull respectfully re-
presents unto your Honorable Court:

FIRST: That a certain Benton Stull, late of Frederick County,
Maryland, died intestate in the year 1941, leaving as his only heirs
at law and next of kin your Complainant, Marian Webster Stull, his
widow, and the following children:

Everett Stull, whose wife's name is Grace Stull and who reside
at Creagerstown, Frederick County, Maryland

Lulu Gaver, divorced, who resides at Lewistown, Frederick County,
Maryland

Emma Stottlemyer, whose husband's name is Merhl Stottlemyer,
and who reside near Utica, Frederick County, Maryland

Guy Stull, whose wife's name is Madeline Stull and who
reside in Lewistown, Frederick County, Maryland.

Ray Stull, unmarried, who resides at Creagerstown, Frederick
County, Maryland

SECOND: That the said Benton Stull, at the time of his death,
was seized and possessed of the following real estate:

of which was acquired by Benton Stull by deed conveying to
