This property is in a good state of preservation and has in my judgment a market value of or should bring at public sale \$4000.00. I know that shortly before he died Elmer E. Buhrman was offered \$7000.00 for it and during the war was offered \$12,000.00.

Elmer E. Buhrman, at the time of his death, left surviving him the following heirs at law:

A daughter, Luella Buhrman, Johnson, who is of age and who was married to a certain William O'Malley but is now married and was at the time of the filing of the Bill of Complaint, to Edwin A. Johnson, both of these parties residing in Chicago, Illinois.

A son, Martin Buhrman, an adult, whose wife's name is Irene Buhrman, and who did live in Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland, but at the time of the filing of the Bill of Complaint had left Hagerstown.

Another son, Clyde Buhrman, an adult, whose wife's name is Lucy Buhrman, and who reside at Lentz, Maryland.

A son, Walter K. Buhrman, whose wife's name is Edith Buhrman, and who reside in Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland, and who are the Complainants in this cause.

Robert Buhrman, an infant, son of Floyd Buhrman, a deceased son of Elmer E. Buhrman, and who is a non-resident of the State of Maryland, and resides in York, Pennsylvania,
