TO THE HONORABLE. THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Bill of Complaint of Claude N. Beacht and Talmadge Beacht, his wife, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

(1) That Nellie Beacht, late of Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, widow of Edward Thomas Beacht who predeceased the said Nellie Beacht, departed this life intestate on or about November 25th, 1941, seized and possessed of a tract or parcel of ground improved by a dwelling house thereon, known as No. 117 West C Street, in the town of Brunswick, Frederick County, Maryland, being the same real estate that was heretofore conveyed unto Edward Thomas Beacht and Nellie Beacht, his wife, by deed from Americus A. Wenner, et al, dated May 15, 1920 and recorded in Liber 333, folio 418, etc., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, a certified copy of which said deed is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 1.
