G: Patrick M. Spalding, a son, who has since intermarried with Karolyn H. Spalding.

H: Rita P. Spalding, a daughter, unmarried.

I: J. Frank Spalding, a son, who has since intermarried with Eleanor L. Spalding.

3rd: That the said Clarence E. Spalding and Marion E. Spalding, his wife, Margaret C. Garey and Matthew A. Garey, her husband, Charles R. Spalding and Theresa Spalding, his wife, Mary J. Goldberg and Charles Goldberg, her husband, Patrick M. Spalding and Karolyn H. Spalding, his wife, Rita P. Spalding, unmarried and J. Frank Spalding and Eleanor L. Spalding, his wife, by a deed dated the 12th day of August, 1941, and recorded among the Land Records of Frederick County on the 13th day of August 1941, conveyed all their right, title and interest in and to the real estate of which their said father, Martin J. Spalding, died seized and possessed and especially the parcels of ground hereinabove specifically referred to, unto your Oratrix, Bernadette Spalding, a certified copy of said Deed being filed herewith, marked Plaintiff's Exhibit #2 and prayed to be taken as a part hereof.

4th: That the said Martin J. Spalding was a resident of the State of Maryland and died intestate, leaving the above referred to real estate, but not leaving personal estate in the State, as far as is known; and your Oratrix believes and therefore avers that it is proper for this Honorable Court, in the event of a sale of said property, to provide in its decree for such sale, for a notice to creditors of the said Martin J. Spalding, not exceeding ninety days, all as provided in the Annotated Code of the Public General Laws of Maryland, Article 93, Section 117.
