Q. Will you state your full name, age and address.

A. Oliver Benner Wisotzkey. I will be 72 in July. I live at Thurmont, Maryland.

Q. You are a brother of J. Emory Wisotzkey?

A. Yes.

Q. Prior to his death, were you engaged in business together?

A. Yes.

Q. What was the nature of your business?

A. We had a confectionery store, and also sold general notions. At Christmas we sold toys.

Q. When did your brother die?

A. June 23, 1940.

Q. Do you know whether or not he left a Will?

A. He told me he had a will, but I have never been able to find one.

Q. Have letters of administration been granted on his estate?

A. Yes, they have been granted to his widow, Belva L. Wisotzkey.

Q. Did your brother own any real estate at the time of his death?

A. He owned a residence on Lombard Street, and we owned jointly the property in which we conducted the store business.

Q. The deeds that have previously been offered in evidence correctly describe the property of which your brother died seized and possessed, do they not?

A. Yes, they do.

Q. Will you kindly express your opinion as to the value of the properties in which your brother had an interest?
