Final Decree.

This cause being submitted and the proceedings therein having been read and considered by the Court:-

IT IS THEREUPON this 20th day of August 1954, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland, in Equity, and by the authority thereof, ADJUDGED, ORDERED and DECREED that all rights of redemption of all the defendants, James H. Falk, Collector of Taxes for Frederick County, Maryland, Blanche Funk, widow, Cora B. Funk, unmarried, Austin P. Funk and Mary Funk, his wife, Paul A. Funk, divorced, Mary E. Reason and George Reason, her husband, Catherine Funk, widow of Everett C., Charles N. Funk and Iva Funk, his wife, Melvin Funk and wife, Eugene Funk and wife, "Sonny" Funk and wife, Connie Funk, unmarried, Ethel Funk, unmarried, Mae Funk Stockman, (former widow of Lester Funk) and Harry Stockman, her husband, Hazel M. Mazur and Joseph F. Mazur, her husband, Edna M. White and Charles O. White, her husband, record owners of one-acre parcel of land and improvements at Park Mills, in Urbana District, Frederick County, Maryland, assessed in the name of Martha Dixon Funk, and all persons having or claiming to have any interest in said property, be, and they are hereby, foreclosed from all rights of redemption in said property, and that James H. Falk, County Treasurer and Tax Collector of Frederick County, Maryland, be, and he is hereby, directed to execute deed, in fee simple, to Elmer B. Funk and Ruth V. Funk, his wife, the Plaintiffs in these proceedings and the holders of the Certificate of Sale, upon payment to the said James H. Falk, County Treasurer of Frederick County, Maryland, of the balance of the purchase price of the property, together with all taxes, interest and penalties thereon accruing subsequent to the date of April 13, 1953.
