

OLIVE JEAN BROWN, one of the Complainants herein, a witness of lawful age, after having been first duly sworn, deposes and says:

Q: Please state your ^{full} name for the Court.

A: Olive Jean Brown.

Q: You are the daughter of Wilson Porter Smith and the wife of Lloyd J. Brown?

A: Yes.

Q: You are one of the complainants in this proceeding?

A: Yes.
