TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR
FREDERICK COUNTY, SITTING AS A COURT IN EQUITY:

The petition of Nannie M. Renn of Frederick County,
respectfully shows unto your Honors:

FIRST: That Charles L. Renn, the husband of your
petitioner, a resident of Frederick County, State of Maryland,
recently departed this life leaving a last will and testament
which was probated, admitted to record and recorded in Liber C.
H. B. No. 1, Folio 370, one of the record books for wills in the
office of the Register of Wills for Frederick County.

SECOND: That by the provisions of said will said testat-
or, after providing for the payment of his debts and funeral expen-
ses and bequeathing the sum of \$2,000.00 to Mount Olivet Cemetery
Company provided as follows:

"THIRD: All the rest and residue of my estate,
of every kind, character and description, and wheresoever
the same may be situate, I hereby give, devise and bequeath
to Holmes D. Baker, Joseph McDivit and William G. Zimmer-
man, at the present time President, Vice-President and
Cashier, respectively, of the Citizens National Bank of
Frederick, Maryland and to their successors in said
offices, but to act not in their capacities as officials
of said bank, but as individuals, in trust and confidence
nevertheless, to have and to hold, sell, invest and rein-
vest, from time to time, as their judgment may dictate,
all of the aforesaid residue of my estate, except the farm
known as the Wallis Farm, hereinafter described, which, while
it shall be part of the trust estate, shall not be sold,
but shall be held as hereinafter specified, and to pay the
net income arising from the entire rest and residue of my
estate, aforesaid, unto my wife, Nannie M. Renn, for and
during her natural life, and for her exclusive use and
benefit."

and did further provide that upon the death of your petitioner said
trustees or their successors should continue to hold the farm known
as the Wallis Farm and out of the corpus of the trust should pay
and provide for certain pecuniary legacies in said will mentioned;
and then further that the residue of the estate, except the Wallis
Farm, should be converted into cash and held in trust by said
trustees or their successors, who were directed within twelve months
