TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of Charles L. Thompson, Committee, by Stewart Hobbs Brown, his solicitor, respectfully represents unto your Honorable Court:

FIRST: That by an Order of your Honorable Court dated the 3rd day of December, 1954, Charles L. Thompson was appointed Committee to take charge, care for and manage the property of the said Mary V. THIRD: That John F. Thompson, died intestate, on or about December 31, 1930, survived by the following named heirs at law and next of kin: his widow, Mary V. Thompson, the said Incompetent; a daughter, Susie B. Culler (by a previous marriage); a daughter, Lydia G. Maple, widow; a son, John W. Thompson; a son, George R. Thompson; a son, Thomas F. Thompson; a son, Charles L. Thompson; a daughter, Anna V. Lawson.

FOURTH: That by a deed dated February 8, 1955, (as yet unrecorded), the heirs at law and next of kin of John F. Thompson, (excepting Susie B. Culler) conveyed all of their right, title and interest to the property described therein unto Charles L. Thompson, Committee, for the sole use, maintenance, benefit, comfort and support of their mother, the said Mary V. Thompson.

FIFTH: That by a Contract and Agreement dated the 19th day of April, 1955, marked Exhibit "Contract", attached hereto and prayed to be taken as a part hereof, a contract was entered into by Charles L. Thompson, Committee, and Susie B. Culler, widow, as parties of the first part and B. E. Walker, Jr., and Audrey M.
