

Florence Jeanette Loots; and the following heirs and next of kin of G. W. Charles Loots: John Loots, a Brother whose wife's name is Loots; Ella Loots, a Sister; and William Mainhart and David Mainhart the children of Mainhart, a deceased daughter of G. W. Charles Loots by a first marriage of the said G. W. Charles Loots, all of whom claim an interest in said real estate the nature and extent of which is unknown to your Orator and is respectfully submitted to your Honorable Court for its determination. All of the above parties being adults and residing in Frederick County.

THIRD: That the said lots or parcels of land mentioned and described in Exhibit No. 1 are not capable of partition and division amongst all the parties having an interest therein without loss and injury and it would be to the benefit and advantage of all the parties' interest that said lots or parcels of land be sold and the proceeds, after the payment of the costs and expenses, of this proceeding be divided amongst the parties according to their respective interests therein.

Your Orator therefore prays--

FIRST: That the said lots or parcels of land mentioned and described in Exhibit No. 1 be sold at public or private sale by a Trustee or Trustees to be appointed by the Court, and if at private sale at a price not less than Nine Hundred Dollars, (\$900.00) to be reported to and finally ratified and confirmed by your Honorable Court, and the proceeds of such sale be brought into Court to be distributed, after the payment of all expenses attending this proceeding, to such persons as your honorable Court shall determine are entitled to the same.

And for General Relief.

May it please your honors to grant unto your Orator the writ of subpoena in its usual form to be served by the Sheriff, commanding the said John Loots and Loots, his wife, Ella
