(2) Daniel S. Repp, a brother, whose wife's name is Lavinia Repp, residents of Carroll County, Maryland.

(3) Maud Humerick, (widow), a sister, she residing in Carroll County, Maryland, all of whom are adults.

(4) Also the children and heirs at law of Manassah O. Repp, a brother, who predeceased the said Rachael J. Grossnickle Garber, intestate, namely:
