TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition and Report of Sale of Real Estate made by Edward D. Storm and Sherman P. Bowers, Trustees in the above-entitled matter, respectfully shows:

FIRST:- That in pursuance of an Order of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, passed in the above-entitled matter, on the 10th day of June, 1958, the undersigned Trustees, after filing their duly approved bond, and giving notice of the time, place, manner and terms of sale by advertising in the Frederick Post, a newspaper published in Frederick County once a week for three successive weeks prior to the date of sale, as appears from the Printer's Certificate, filed herewith as part of this Petition and marked "Exhibit A", and

SECOND: That pursuant to said Notice, your Trustees did attend at the premises and late home of Edward B. Oram, ^{deceased,} in the town of New Market, in Frederick County, Maryland, on Saturday, July 19, 1958, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock, P. M., D.S.T., and then and there proceeded to sell the Real Estate mentioned in these proceedings, to wit:

a. All that lot of land in New Market aforesaid, being the same land referred to and described in the deed from M. Adelaide Oram, et al., to William O. Lee and Florence Snowden, dated March 27, 1940, Lib. 423, fol. 347, said land fronts 50 feet, more or less, on the public road leading from New Market to Monrovia and adjoining Grange Hall property and extends eastwardly for depth of 175 feet, more or less, and is improved by an 8-room weatherboarded dwelling house with paintshop building in rear and well of water, and which land descended to the heirs at law and next of kin mentioned in the said Equity cause.
