The object of this Bill is to procure a decree on behalf of creditors for the sale of the interest in certain real estate of Fannie K. Main and Daniel Clinton Main, her husband, both deceased.

The Bill states in substance that the Plaintiffs are residents of Frederick County, Maryland, engaged in the undertaking business and that the Defendants, George R. Baker, who was duly appointed Guardian for Betty Jane Main, Daniel Lease Main and Margaret Ellen Main, infants, by the Wood County Court, and the said infants under the age of 21 years, are residents of the City of Wisconsin Rapids, State of Wisconsin; that a certain Alice Virginia Lease died intestate on October 5, 1935, leaving as her sole heir-at-law her daughter, Fannie K. Lease, who married Daniel Clinton Main; that Fannie K. Lease died intestate on or about January 18, 1936, leaving as her only heirs-at-law the three aforementioned infant children, Betty Jane Main, Daniel Lease Main and Margaret Ellen Main, and her husband, Daniel Clinton Main; that the said Daniel Clinton Main died intestate on or about January 25, 1941, leaving as his only heirs-at-law the three aforementioned children; that Alice Virginia Lease was seized of a certain tract or parcel of land in Bartonsville, New Market, District, Frederick County, Maryland, containing two and one-eighth (2 $\frac{1}{8}$) acres of land, more or less, improved with a long and frame dwelling house, being the same real estate that was conveyed to her by Jacob Smith, etc. ux., by deed dated February 6, 1897, and recorded in Liber J. L. J. 14, folio 640; that the said Fannie K. Main and Daniel Clinton Main, both deceased, were indebted to the Plaintiffs for their burial expenses; and that said decedents died without leaving personal estates sufficient to pay their debts and the costs of the administration of their estates, and further, that no letters of administration have been granted. The Bill then prays that the real estate therein mentioned, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be sold by Trustee or Trustees to be appointed by the Court for the payment of the claims of the Plaintiffs and other creditors, and for general relief and process.

It is thereupon this 5th day of May, 1941, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, ORDERED that the Plaintiffs give notice to the said non-resident Defendants of the object and substance of this Bill by causing a copy of the same to be published in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once a week for four successive weeks prior to the 7th day of June, 1941, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in this Court, in person or by solicitor, on or before the 23rd day of June, 1941, and show cause, if any they or each of them have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.
