A I went up there every fall to hunt. I never missed a fall. I went up there lots. Only place I had to go to fish.

Q Fish and hunt? A. Yes.

Q Did you go to visit your brother?

A He came down to see me very often too.

Q So from the time he bought the property up to the time he died he paid for the upkeep and insurance and taxes and all repairs, is that correct?

A I don't know what he did.

Q At least you didn't, isn't that correct?

A He didn't put no fencing on. He done a little repairing to the house.

Q but I say you did not do any of that?

A No.

Q The total amount of those three tracts is about 17 acres, isn't it?
