

Paragraph of this Bill of Complaint to her nieces, Fanny C. Ensor and Helen C. Burdette, and her nephews, James Maurice Carlisle, Jr. and Richard V. Carlisle; that your Complainant, Fanny C. Ensor, intermarried with your Complainant, Harry M. Ensor; that your Complainant, Helen C. Burdette, intermarried with your Complainant, Lloyd W. Burdette; that your Complainant, James Maurice Carlisle, Jr., intermarried with Mary Ann Carlisle and all reside at Dickerson, Maryland.

THIRD: That all of the above mentioned heirs at law of the said William Vernon Manion and devisees of Lucy L. Carlisle are adults, except Richard V. Carlisle.

FOURTH: That all of the said real estate mentioned and described in this Bill of Complaint is not susceptible of partition without material loss and injury to the parties entitled to interest therein, as above stated, and that in order to make a division of said interest, it will be necessary and it will then be to the best interest of all parties concerned therein, that the said real estate be sold and the proceeds thereof be divided among the parties entitled thereto, according to their respective interest therein.

TO THE END THEREFORE:

1. That a Decree may be passed by your Honorable Court for the sale of said real estate mentioned in the foregoing Bill of Complaint by Trustee or Trustees to be appointed thereunder, and the proceeds distributed under the direction of your Honorable Court to the parties entitled according to their respective interests.

2. That your Complainants may have such other and further relief as the nature of their case may require.

And your Complainants pray for the following process:

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Complainant the Order of Publication giving notice to the said William A. Manion and Irene Manion, his wife, both of 3628 Sta Mesa Blvd., Manila, Philippine Islands, as aforesaid, who are non-residents of this State, of the object and substance of this Bill, and warning them to appear in this Court, in person or by solicitor, on or before a certain day, to be named therein, to show cause, if any they have, why a Decree ought not to be passed as prayed; and also the Writ of Subpoena
