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Q. And do you think it should be sold promptly?

A. I do. And I think it would be advantageous to all of the parties concerned to sell the property at public sale.

Cross examination waived.

Q. General Interrogatory, &c.?

A. Nothing additional.

of Sherman P. Bowers, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainants, being first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:-

I have been a Member of the Bar since 1916 and practiced law here in Frederick City, in Frederick County during that time. Elizabeth, one of the children, was my secretary for about two years, some ten years ago and I have known the Stevens' family ever since that time. I was out with the appraisers when they made the appraisal of the personal property and the farm. I know from personal talk with practically all of the children that they wish the farm and personal property sold at public sale as soon as convenient. My judgment is that it would be impossible to divide the farm among the eleven children without great loss and injury and that the best way to have equality is to have a public sale and divide the proceeds among the children according to law. All of the children and parties interested have signed requests that the property be sold as quickly as possible, which paper I am filing herewith.
