TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of Charles H. Jamison, Guardian of Charles Thomas Jamison, Laura Margaret Jamison, William Henry Jamison, Amy Elizabeth Jamison, Robert Paul Jamison and Franklin Andrew Jamison, his minor children, by W. Jerome Offutt, their Solicitor, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

FIRST: That he was duly appointed Guardian of the said minor children on the 17th day of June, 1959, by the Orphans' Court of Montgomery County, State of Maryland and did duly qualify by giving bond in the penalty of the sum of ^{Thousand} Twenty/(\$20,000.00) Dollars, with sureties, approved by the said Court for the faithful performance of his duty as Guardian to said infants, a certified copy of said "Guardian Certificate" being filed herewith as part hereof, marked "Exhibit A".

SECOND: That the said minors, whose ages are hereinafter set forth, had bequeathed to them by Charles A. Harris, late of Montgomery County, deceased, a certain parcel of land located in Frederick County, Maryland, containing 28 acres, more or less, located one-half mile west of the Mt. Ephriam-Park Mill Road on the Turner's Store, Furnace Ford Road, now known as Proctor Road, in Urbana Election District, a copy of said Last Will and Testament is now of record in the Office of the Register of Wills for Frederick County, in Liber H.D.R. No. 2, folio 302, all of which will fully appear by reference to a certified copy of said Will filed herein as a part hereof, marked "Exhibit B;" that said parcel of land was conveyed to the said Charles Harris by The Washington Home for Incurables, a body corporate of the District of Columbia, in a Deed dated September 7, 1915 and recorded in Liber 314, folio 193, one of the Land Records of Frederick County,
