The object of this suit is to procure a
Decree for the sale of certain real es-
tate of which James Lawrence Withrow,
late of Frederick County, Maryland, died
seized and possessed.

The Bill states that said James Law-
rence Withrow, late of Brunswick, in
Frederick County, Maryland, died on
the date October 7, 1940, intestate, leav-
ing no widow, but leaving the following
children and grandchildren surviving
him as his heirs at law, namely:—

Edward H. Withrow, a son, intermar-
ried with Ruth Withrow and resides in
the City of Baltimore, Maryland, both
of whom are of full age.

Earl J. Withrow, a son, intermarried
with Ercy Withrow and resides in Green
County, Ohio, both of whom are of full
age.

Margaret W. Beck, a daughter who
has intermarried with Sylvester Beck
and resides in Erie County, New York
State, both of whom are of full age.

Elizabeth W. Rothleutner, a daughter
who has intermarried with Frank
Rothleutner and resides in Converse
County, Wyoming, both of whom are of
full age.

Mary L. Withrow, a daughter, unmar-
ried, who resides in Wayne County,
Ohio, who is of full age.

Pauline W. Berry, a daughter who has
intermarried with Everette Berry and
who resides in Frederick County, Mary-
land, both of whom are of full age.

Rose W. Johnson, a daughter who has
intermarried with Lester Johnson and
who resides in Converse County, Wyom-
ing, both of whom are of full age.

Rita Withrow, a daughter, unmarried,
who is an infant and who resides in
the District of Columbia.

Roy A. and Ruth Ann Withrow, in-
fants, unmarried, and the only chil-
dren of Jesse H. Withrow, who died
March 1, 1940, and who was a son of
James Lawrence Withrow, and which
said infants reside in Hennepin County,
Minnesota.

That said James Lawrence Withrow
left no personal property of any value
whatever, and no Letters of Adminis-
tration have been applied for or granted
for his estate by the Orphans' Court for
Frederick County, Maryland;

That at the time of his death the said
James Lawrence Withrow was pos-
sessed of a lot of ground known as lot
No. 45 on Plat of W. W. Wenner's first
addition to Brunswick, in Frederick
County, Maryland, improved with a
frame weather-boarded dwelling house
known as No. 415 Walnut Street, also a
part of lot No. 44 on said Plat improved
with a frame weather-boarded dwelling
house known as No. 413 Walnut Street,
being all of the same real estate de-
scribed in the Deed from Gilmore R.
Plautt and wife to James L. Withrow
and wife, dated October 1, 1937, and re-
corded in Liber No. 409, at folio 268,
one of the Land Records of Frederick
County;

That the estate of the said James
Lawrence Withrow was indebted unto
the Plaintiffs in the sum of \$165.00 for
funeral expenses of the decedent;—

That there being no personal estate
of the decedent to discharge all of the
just debts due and owing by him, or
unto the Plaintiffs by his estate, and
said real estate being of more value
than all of the debts due and owing by
the decedent, or by his estate, the Plain-
tiffs pray the Court to pass a Decree
that the real estate of said decedent be
sold by a Trustee to be appointed by
the Court for the purpose of applying
net proceeds arising therefrom to the
payment of the just debts owing by said
decedent at the time of his death, and
any debts due by his estate and to any
other creditors who may be legally en-
titled thereto.

adults; Rita Withrow, infant; Roy A.
Withrow, infant; and Ruth Ann With-
row, infant; who are absent, non-resi-
dent Defendants, of the object and
substance of this Bill, warning them
and each of them to be and appear in
this Court in person or by Solicitor, on
or before the 7th day of July, 1941, to
show cause, if any they have, why a
Decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
