TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR  
FREDERICK COUNTY, SITTING AS A COURT OF EQUITY:

The Petition and Report of Sale of Parsons Newman,  
Assignee of a mortgage executed by Charles F. Crawford and Laura  
B. Crawford, his wife, to Emma Pearl Prevost, respectfully shows  
unto your Honors: .

First: That on the twenty-first day of May, in the year  
1913, Charles F. Crawford and Laura B. Crawford, his wife, being  
then indebted to Emma Pearl Prevost, in the sum of Four Thousand  
Dollars (\$4,000.00), as evidenced by their promissory note of said  
date for said sum of money payable to the said Emma Pearl Prevost  
**or order** six months after date with interest from date at the rate  
of 5 per cent per annum executed their deed of mortgage of said  
date to secure the payment of said note and interest which said  
mortgage is recorded in Liber H. W. B. No. 305, Folio 136, one of  
the Land Records of Frederick County, whereby the said Charles F.  
Crawford and Laura B. Crawford, his wife, conveyed unto the said  
Emma Pearl Prevost all that farm, pieces or parts of tract of land  
situate, lying and being in the County of Frederick in the State  
of Maryland, in Urbana District, known by the name of "Woodlawn,"  
containing in the aggregate 147 acres, 2 roods, and 21 perches of  
land, more or less, (the quantity of land being erroneously stated  
to be 149 acres, 2 roods, and 21 perches of land, more or less, in  
the advertisement of sale) and being composed of three parcels of  
land as follows:

The first parcel being part of a tract of land called  
"The Resurvey on Right and Good Reason," and part of a tract of  
land called "Woodstock" containing together, one hundred and twenty-
