A. Yes I have lived there about 36 years. It is worth about three hundred and fifty dollars. I built a new garage, chicken house hog pen etc.,

5. Is the real estate susceptible of partition amongst the parties interested without loss and injury.

A. It can not, it is just a house and lot and would be of no value if divided.

To the general interrogatory?

That is all I know. I do not think they ought to claim any thing in the house.
