Your Complainant, the Community Finance Company, a body corporate,
 of the State of Delaware, by its Attorney, Alban M. Wood, who sues as well for
 itself as for all other creditors of Susan V. Reynolds, widow, late of Frederick
 County, deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit,
 says:

FIRST: That a certain Susan V. Reynolds died intestate on or about
 August 3rd, 1930, seized and possessed in fee simple of a certain tract of land,
 with improvements thereon, situated in Frederick City, Frederick County, Mary-
 land, and known as No. 140 West South Street and more particularly described in
