

to a very great extent, had taken care of her for 21 months before her death. She had no bank account, her husband having died about two years prior to her death. Several times just prior to her death, it was necessary to secure funds for required expenses and on April 15th, 1930, or thereabouts, we borrowed the sum of One Hundred Eighty-nine Dollars and Ninety-seven (\$189.97) Cents from the Community Finance Company, which money was used for her purposes and on that note was paid the sum of Forty-seven (\$47.00) Dollars, leaving a balance of One Hundred Forty-two Dollars and Ninety-seven (\$142.97) Cents, and on July 8th, 1930, we borrowed the sum of Eighty-two Dollars and Fifty (\$82.50) Cents from the Community Finance Company, or at least my wife did, which money was used either to pay her bills or for her expenses. Both of these notes were signed by Mrs. Reynolds and both were in arrears at the time of her death. Mrs. Reynolds, owned at the time of her death, a parlor suit which was very old, a half dozen chairs, two wash stands, one dresser, one bed, one Axminster rug on the floor, about five years old, one large mirror and two small stands and all of this property is in the house on West South Street and if sold at a second hand furniture sale would bring about Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars.

4. From your answers of the above questions, you are positive that Mrs. Reynolds left no other personal property except that enumerated above?

A Yes, sir, I know this because my wife and myself transacted her business for her I have known Mrs. Reynolds very well for the past ten years and she had no bank account at any time during this time and never kept any money in the house. Mr. Reynolds, when he died, left no bank account. Mr. William Reynolds, a brother of my wife, paid his father's funeral expenses, as he had no funds with which to pay them.

5. Do you have any knowledge of the value of real estate in the vicinity where Mrs. Reynolds property is located?

A I have.

6. To the best of your knowledge and belief, what is the value of the property of Mrs. Susan V. Reynolds, that is, the house and lot, together with the additional lot in the rear?

A I would say Twenty-five Hundred (\$2500.00) Dollars.
