When I took that paper to Mr. Stoner he said if I kept a record of everything taken in and how it is spent was all was necessary, and I should bring it to the bank once a year, of all monies that was taken in and all that was spent. They never asked me that at the Frederick County Bank.

Q Were you able -- did you have any income from the farm from the last two or three years?

A Well I have some income, yes, but not enough to get any money ahead, you see, because till I pay the taxes and fertilizer and all like that, it took all the income of what I got. I can show you. I got it all at the house. I can show you where the money all was spent and how it was paid out, and I can show you all that, but it was so little, you see, that it wasn't enough to get ahead, to go ahead to do this repairing.

Q (The Court) How about the income from your houses?

A Well I have all of it.

Q What houses do you get income from?

A I have two houses; one across the street, a double house, and one up street, but I don't get much for that, only a small rent.

Q What rent do you get?

A I get \$10 for three of them, well four of them, and \$12.50 for the other, because the first house is three apartments, and up at the other house is two apartments there, you see.

Q Then you get \$30 for the one?

A No, \$32.50 for the one house and \$20 for the other one.
